3	CREATING THE PERMANENT JOINT LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE
4	ON MEDICAID POLICY
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6	WHEREAS, funding to the Alabama Medicaid Agency is
7	paramount to Medicaid eligibles receiving services and to the
8	State of Alabama's financial future; and
9	WHEREAS, reliable and affordable Medicaid services
10	is of great importance to all sectors of Alabama's economy;
11	and
12	WHEREAS, long-term sustainability of Medicaid
13	services is becoming increasingly important to Alabama's
14	population; and
15	WHEREAS, the future medical needs for Medicaid
16	recipients of the State present opportunities to diversify the
17	State's health care and provide new opportunities for
18	coordination between health care related state agencies and
19	programs; and
20	WHEREAS, the use of existing programs and
21	development of new programs should be encouraged as ways of
22	reducing costs to the Alabama Medicaid Agency and continuing
23	to provide services to Medicaid eligibles; and
24	WHEREAS, the Legislature recognizes that an
25	integrated and comprehensive state policy on the Alabama

Medicaid Program is necessary to address the future health
 care needs and costs to the State; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the Permanent Joint Legislative Committee on Medicaid Policy is created for the purpose of developing recommendations to the Governor and the Legislature to address the State's long-term and short-term Medicaid challenges. The Committee shall be composed of fourteen members as follows:

10 The Chair of the House Committee on Health; the 11 Chair of the House Ways and Means General Fund Committee; the 12 Chair of the Senate Committee on Health; the Chair of the 13 Senate Committee on Finance and Taxation General Fund; five 14 members of the House appointed by the Speaker of the House of 15 Representatives; two members of the Senate appointed by the 16 Lieutenant Governor; and three members of the Senate appointed 17 by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate.

18 The Committee shall make a continuous study of the 19 Alabama Medicaid Program and make recommendations for 20 legislation and initiatives that will create the necessary 21 statutory, regulatory, and institutional changes to accomplish 22 the overall goals and objectives of the Alabama Medicaid Plan 23 in a manner that benefits the State and protects Medicaid 24 recipients. The Committee shall seek direct involvement with 25 the State Health Officer in its study of the Alabama Medicaid

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Program. The Committee may also engage existing universities 1 in the State of Alabama for support and research activities as 2 3 they pertain to the Alabama Medicaid Agency and the Alabama Medicaid Plan. 4 5 The Alabama Medicaid Plan shall be designed to achieve the following goals and objectives: 6 (a) The expansion of existing programs and 7 8 implementation of new programs to meet the Alabama Medicaid Agency's current and future health care and funding needs, 9 10 through: (1) Encouraging effective strategies to avoid 11 12 decreases in eligibility due to funding shortages; 13 (2) Promoting existing programs and new programs to 14 realize cost savings to the Agency; 15 (3) Expanding existing programs within the Agency 16 that have proven to provide cost effective high quality care. 17 (b) The development of coordinated care programs, through: 18 19 (1) Identification and promotion of proven 20 coordinated care programs in other states' Medicaid programs; 21 (2) Incorporating coordinated care programs in the 22 Alabama Medicaid Agency. 23 The Alabama Medicaid Plan shall include for each 24 goal and objective:

(1) An identification of actions already in progress;

3 (2) A prioritized list of recommended
4 non-legislative action items;

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(3) Recommended legislative proposals; and

6 (4) An identification of areas on which further 7 evaluation or research is recommended.

8 The Committee shall submit its recommendations by the fifth legislative day of the 2013 Regular Session and by 9 10 the fifth legislative day of each Regular Session thereafter. The initial recommendations from the Committee shall address 11 12 cost saving strategies and effective coordinated care programs 13 for the Alabama Medicaid Agency. The Committee may make 14 additional recommendations and submit studies and reports to 15 the Legislature at any time.

16 The Chair of the Committee shall create and appoint 17 members to advisory committees, which shall include members of 18 the Committee, representatives from governmental agencies, and 19 members of the public with interest and expertise in the objectives of the Committee. The Commissioner of the Alabama 20 21 Medicaid Agency, or his or her designee, shall be a member of 22 each advisory committee created. Each advisory committee shall be chaired by a member of the advisory committee who shall be 23 24 elected by the members of the advisory committee, appointed by 25 the Chair of the Committee. The Alabama Medicaid Agency and

the Commissioner of the Alabama Medicaid Agency may make
 recommendations to the Chair of the Committee for appointments
 of members to each advisory committee.

The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall 4 5 set the date of the first meeting of the Committee, at which a chair and vice chair of the Committee shall be elected by the 6 members of the Committee. The Committee shall thereafter meet 7 8 at the call of the chair or any majority of the members 9 thereof; provided, that the Committee shall meet at least once 10 each four months. The Committee shall have a continuing existence and may meet, act, and conduct its business at any 11 place within this state during the sessions of the Legislature 12 13 or any recess thereof, and in the interim period between 14 The Secretary of the Senate, the Clerk of the House sessions. of Representatives, and the advisory committees created herein 15 16 shall provide any assistance as may be necessary at the 17 Committee's request. Each member of the Committee shall be entitled to his or her regular legislative compensation, his 18 19 or her per diem, and travel expenses for each day he or she 20 attends a meeting of the Committee, which shall be paid out of 21 any funds appropriated for the use of the Legislature, upon 22 warrants drawn by the State Comptroller, upon requisitions 23 signed by the Committee's chair; provided however, that 24 members shall not receive additional legislative compensation 25 or per diem when the Legislature is in session or if a member

1 is being paid any other payments on the same dates for 2 attendance on other state business. Annual expenses and 3 compensation of the Committee shall not exceed \$1,000. To the 4 extent possible, members of both the Legislative and the 5 advisory committees shall reflect the racial, ethnic, gender, 6 geographic, urban/rural and economic diversity of the State.
