18	joined the United States Army in 1950; following his military
19	career, he attended Victoria College and Texas A&M University;
20	he attended Auburn University on a National Defense Education
21	Act Graduate Fellowship where he earned a master's degree and
22	doctoral degree; he worked as a research scientist prior to
23	returning to Auburn as an assistant professor of agronomy and
24	soils in 1968; and
25	WHEREAS, Dr. Hajek is an outstanding researcher and
26	instructor of both undergraduate and graduate courses,
27	specializing in soil classification and clay mineralogy; his

teams have won unprecedented successive national championships in Intercollegiate Soils Judging Competitions in 1978, 1979, and 1980; his team won the national championship again in 1986, and he served as a volunteer assistant for the team that won the championship in 2003; and

WHEREAS, during his career, Dr. Hajek has received honors including the Alabama Agricultural Experiment Station Director's Research Award and election as a Fellow of Soil Science Society of America; although he retired from Auburn University in 1995 as Professor Emeritus in Agronomy and Soils, he continues to provide services to the College of Agriculture and to Alabama's agriculture and forestry industries; and
