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8	URGING THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO FIX THE
9	INEQUITABLE MEDICARE PAYMENT FORMULA FOR ALABAMA HOSPITALS.
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11	WHEREAS, hospitals in Alabama have provided
12	excellent care to their communities for many years and were
13	the forerunners for modern hospitals across the country due to
14	the influence of Senator Lister Hill and his vision for
15	community-supported modern medical facilities; and
16	WHEREAS, hospitals in Alabama are a major employer
17	in the state providing 81,500 direct jobs with an annual
18	payroll of \$4.1 billion and indirectly creating thousands of
19	additional jobs in the community adding billions more to the
20	state's economy; and
21	WHEREAS, over time, hospitals in Alabama have not
22	only provided good care to patients, but have done so in a
23	very efficient manner. A recent study showed that Alabama's
24	hospitals had the lowest average cost per hospital stay in the
25	country and received the lowest average payments for their
26	services; and

1 WHEREAS, the formula for calculating Medicare
2 hospital payments has been especially challenging for
3 hospitals in this state due to the inequities built into the
4 payment calculation, specifically the factor used to
5 incorporate variations in wages; and

WHEREAS, by applying this factor, some hospitals in the country receive a significantly higher payment for the exact same procedure as those performed in Alabama, and with approximately 40 percent of Alabama's patients covered by Medicare, this inequity is crippling for many hospitals; and

WHEREAS, in the most recent survey of hospitals in this state, the average hospital margin was one percent, and if the top seven hospitals were left out of the average, the average drops to a negative 1.2 percent. In total, out of the 92 facilities that responded to the survey, 46 hospitals had negative margins and the worst margin reported was a negative 17 percent; and

WHEREAS, as legislators, we understand the tremendous financial pressures Congress is facing with the federal deficit and know that spending reductions have to be made; however, we also believe it is our responsibility to speak on behalf of Alabama's hospitals that are currently in a very precarious financial situation. Within the past few months, three Alabama rural hospitals have closed, and many others face significant financial challenges; and

WHEREAS, while there are national groups working to address some of these issues, we worry that their

recommendations and subsequent actions may come too late for 1 2 many of our hospitals, and we are concerned about what this could mean for access to health care in Alabama; now 3 therefore, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH 5 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That we express our gratitude for 6 7 the previous leadership of the Alabama Congressional Delegation to fix the formula to calculate Medicare payments 8 to hospitals and urge continued efforts to ensure an equitable 9

Medicare payment formula for all hospitals.

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
