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8 DESIGNATING CERTAIN STATE AND COUNTY ROADS BY NUMBER  
9 AS TRANSITIONAL TRAILS UNTIL THE OLD FEDERAL ROAD ROUTE IS  
10 DESIGNATED AND DEVELOPED.  
11

12 WHEREAS, Act 2007-414 of the 2007 Regular Session  
13 created the Old Federal Road Task Force to determine whether  
14 the Old Federal Road should be promoted as a historical trail;  
15 and

16 WHEREAS, the task force is required to study all  
17 aspects of how best to identify and promote the Old Federal  
18 Road in the state; and

19 WHEREAS, the Old Federal Road Task Force desires to  
20 submit a transitional route that most closely follows the Old  
21 Federal Road in those counties within the state that the road  
22 passed through, beginning in Russell County and continuing  
23 through Mobile County by number until the Old Federal Road  
24 route is designated and developed; now therefore,

25 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH  
26 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the transitional route of the

1 Old Federal Road as determined by the Alabama Department of  
2 Transportation consist of all the following:

3 Russell County: Begin at Fort Mitchell, head north  
4 on AL-165, turn left onto South Seale Road and head southwest,  
5 turn left onto US-431/AL-1 and head southwest, turn left onto  
6 County Road 61 and head southeast, turn right onto County Road  
7 137 and head southwest, turn left onto US-431/AL-1 and head  
8 southwest, turn right onto Indian Trail Road and head  
9 northwest, turn left onto County Road 137 and head southwest,  
10 turn right onto US-431/AL-1 and head southwest, turn left onto  
11 County Road 137 and head southwest, turn right onto County  
12 Road 138 and head northwest to junction of AL-169 and  
13 US-431/AL-1, follow AL-169 to County Road 22, turn left onto  
14 County Road 22 and head west, turn left onto AL-51 and head  
15 south, turn right onto Boromville Road and head west crossing  
16 into Macon County.

17 Macon County: Continue to follow Boromville Road,  
18 turn right onto County Road 10 and head west/northwest to  
19 US-29/AL-15, turn right onto US-29/AL-15 and head northwest to  
20 Tuskegee, turn left onto US-80/AL-8 and head west crossing  
21 into Montgomery County.

22 Montgomery County: Continue to follow US-80/AL-8 to  
23 the Eastern Bypass in Montgomery, turn left onto US-80/AL-8 -  
24 US-231/AL-53 (Eastern Bypass) and head south to junction of  
25 Southern Bypass - US-231/AL-53 South, continue to follow  
26 US-80/AL-8 Southern Bypass to junction of I-65 - Exit 168,  
27 turn left on US-80/AL-8 - I-65 and head south to I-65 - Exit

1 167, turn right onto US-80/AL-8 and head west to junction of  
2 US-31/AL-3, turn left onto US-31/AL-3 and head south to  
3 junction of County Road 24, turn right onto County Road 24 and  
4 head west, turn left onto County Road 055 (Federal Road) and  
5 head southwest, turn left onto County Road 053 (Tabernacle  
6 Road) and head south, turn left onto County Road 054  
7 (Tabernacle Road) and head east/southeast, turn right onto  
8 US-31/AL-3 and head south crossing into Lowndes County.

9 Lowndes County: Continue to follow US-31/AL-3 and  
10 head southwest, turn right onto AL-185 and head west through  
11 Fort Deposit, then south on AL-184 crossing into Butler  
12 County.

13 Butler County: Continue to follow AL-185 southwest,  
14 turn right onto County Road 44 and head west/southwest, turn  
15 left onto County Road 54 and head south, turn right onto  
16 County Road 46 and head west/northwest, turn left onto County  
17 Road 38 and head south/southwest crossing into Conecuh County.

18 Conecuh County: Continue to follow that route which  
19 becomes Owens Road to County Road 16, then head southwest on  
20 Old Federal Road to County Road 29, turn right onto County  
21 Road 29 and head southwest, then north to County Road 79, turn  
22 left onto County Road 79 and head south to County Road 106,  
23 turn right onto County Road 106 and head west, turn left onto  
24 AL-83 and head south, turn right onto County Road 1 and head  
25 southwest, turn right onto County Road 5 and head  
26 south/southwest to US-84/AL-12, turn right onto US-84/AL-12

1 and head west, turn left onto County Road 5 and head southwest  
2 crossing into Escambia County.

3 Escambia County: Continue to follow that route which  
4 becomes County Road 45 south, turn right onto County Road 30  
5 (Pleasant Grove Road) and head west, crossing AL-21, head  
6 west/southwest, turn left at McCullough onto Washington Avenue  
7 and head east, turn right onto Garden Street and head south  
8 (Garden Street turns into Bell Creek Road), continue south on  
9 Bell Creek Road, turn right onto County Road 14 and head  
10 west/northwest, turn right onto County Road 1 and head north,  
11 turn left onto County Road 47 and head west.

12 Baldwin County: Continue to follow that route which  
13 becomes Redtown Road, turn right onto County Road 61 and head  
14 north/northwest, turn left onto AL-59 and head south, turn  
15 right onto AL-225 and continue south, turn right onto  
16 US-31/AL-3 and head west to junction of US-90/AL-16, turn  
17 right and continue west on US-90/AL-16 crossing into Mobile  
18 County.

19 Mobile County: Continue to follow route US-90/AL-16  
20 through Mobile County to the Mississippi state line.

21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this act supersedes Act  
22 2008-370, HJR227, of the 2008 Regular Session (Acts 2008, p.  
23 657).
