15	(a) The Alabama State Employees Comprehensive
16	Wellness Center Initiative Study Commission shall be composed
17	of the following members:
18	(1) The Speaker of the House of Representatives or
19	his or her designee.
20	(2) The President Pro Tempore of the Senate or his
21	or her designee.
22	(3) The Chair of the Senate Health Committee or his
23	or her designee.
24	(4) The Chair of the House Health Committee or his
25	or her designee.

(5) The Chair of the House Ways and Means General
 Fund Committee or his or her designee, who shall serve as
 co-chair of the commission.

4 (6) The Chair of the Senate Finance and Taxation
5 General Fund Committee or his or her designee, who shall serve
6 as co-chair of the commission.

7 (7) One member of the Senate and one member of the 8 House of Representatives, each of whom shall be a member of 9 the minority party, to be selected by the co-chairs of the 10 commission.

11 (8) A representative of the State Employees
12 Insurance Board to be appointed by the board.

(9) A representative of the Alabama State EmployeesAssociation to be appointed by the association.

15 (10) A representative of the Alabama Retired State
16 Employees Association to be appointed by the association.

17 (b) The Alabama Law Institute (ALI) shall serve as 18 the primary resource for researching, compiling information, 19 and drafting the recommended changes to the Code of Alabama 20 for the commission. The research shall include the examination 21 of privatized or outsourced wellness centers and programs 22 operated for the use of employees of Alabama municipalities or 23 counties with self-funded insurance programs. The research 24 shall also include the examination of privatized or outsourced 25 wellness centers and programs operated by other states for the public employees with self-funded insurance programs. 26

1 (c) The goals of the commission are to examine and 2 determine if Alabama's state employees and the General Fund 3 Budget would benefit from contracting existing wellness center 4 operations to a third party provider and by expanding access 5 to wellness clinic services by adding additional clinic 6 locations and services.

7 (d) The commission shall be charged with the8 following duties and responsibilities:

9 (1) Upon adjournment of the 2nd Special Session of 10 2015, the commission shall schedule a public hearing within 45 11 calendar days. The public hearing shall be held for the 12 commission to receive input from the public and from 13 individuals and businesses who are involved in providing 14 wellness center management services to public employees in 15 self-funded insurance plans.

16 (2) The commission shall visit two municipalities or
 17 counties deemed by the commission to have the most successful
 18 privatized wellness center services for public employees.

(3) The commission shall publish its findings and
proposals for amending the laws of Alabama on the ALI website
by December 31, 2015, or as soon as practicable thereafter.

(e) Upon request of the co-chairs, the Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the House of Representatives shall provide necessary clerical assistance for the work of the commission. Each legislative member of the commission shall be entitled to his or her regular legislative compensation, per diem, and travel expense for each day he or she attends a

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meeting in accordance with Amendment 871 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901. The payments shall be paid out of any funds appropriated to the use of the Legislature.
