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11	WHEREAS, the costs of collegiate athletics has
12	continually outpaced revenue generated at many public colleges

21	concern over the prohibitive cost of a college education and
22	skyrocketing student debt, has been well-documented recently
23	by many national news and media outlets; and
24	WHEREAS, it is in the public interest that this body
25	examine viable options for providing a more affordable college
26	education with less debt; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the Collegiate Athletics Joint Interim Legislative Study Committee is created. The committee shall be composed of three members of each house, to be appointed by the presiding officer of each house. The appointing authorities shall coordinate their appointments to assure the committee is inclusive and reflects the racial, gender, geographic, urban, rural, and economic diversity of the state. The chair and vice chair of the committee shall be elected at the first meeting by the members of the committee. With the cooperation of public college and university presidents and athletic directors in the state, and other employees and officials of the concerned colleges and universities as the committee deems relevant, the committee shall study all facets of the costs of collegiate athletics on the general student population at all public colleges and universities, excluding those colleges and universities within the University of Alabama System and the Auburn University System.

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That upon the request of the chair, the Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the House of Representatives shall provide necessary clerical assistance for the work of the committee. The committee shall report its findings, conclusions, and recommendations to the Legislature not later than the fifth legislative day of the 2017 Regular Session, whereupon the committee shall stand dissolved and discharged of any further duties and liabilities. Each member

legislative compensation, his or her per diem, and travel expenses for each day he or she attends a meeting of the committee. Upon requisitions signed by the chair of the committee, these payments shall be paid out of any funds appropriated to the use of the Legislature by means of warrants drawn by the Comptroller on the State Treasury. Notwithstanding the foregoing, no member shall receive additional legislative compensation or per diem when the Legislature is in session or if a member is being paid any other payments on the same dates for attendance on other state business. The total expenditures of the committee shall not exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000).
