5 value-added services, including distribution support services,

8 WHEREAS, AMEA's 30-year history has also proved that 9 the organization is an innovator in exploring electric 10 generation options to improve generation costs through such 11 initiatives as the Alabama Direct FuelCell Demonstration 12 Project and the AMEA-Sylacauga Plant, as well as renewable 13 hydropower projects; and

14 WHEREAS, AMEA is committed to a balanced power 15 supply program that promotes harmony with the environment at 16 the lowest cost to its member cities and the citizens they 17 serve; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That we honor and congratulate the Alabama Municipal Electric Authority on its 30 years of service to its members, and we wish the organization much success in helping its members meet the growing energy needs of their customers today and for future generations to come.
