3           COMMENDING ALABAMA TEACHERS AND SCHOOL STAFF FOR  
4 THEIR COURAGEOUS ACTS FOLLOWING THE 2014 WINTER STORM.

6           WHEREAS, on January 27, 2014, a winter storm  
7 bringing snow, ice, and freezing temperatures had a staggering  
8 impact on the State of Alabama; and

9           WHEREAS, the precipitation that accumulated on the  
10 state's roadways resulted in thousands of stranded parents,  
11 families, and caregivers leaving children stuck at daycares  
12 and schools; and

13           WHEREAS, over 11,000 Alabama students were provided  
14 continuous care, shelter, and sustenance at their local  
15 schools for over twenty-four hours thanks to compassionate  
16 teachers, principals, cafeteria workers, school bus drivers  
17 and support staff; and

20 students had a warm place to sleep and food to eat, often  
21 sacrificing time with their own families, to ensure that their
