reared in Mobile, where he attended Mobile Public Schools;
following his graduation from Dunbar High School, he continued
his education by attending Spaulding Business College and
Oakdale Bible College; he graduated from Lomax-Hannon School
of Seminary Studies; he earned his Associate's, Bachelor's,
and Master's Degrees in Divinity from Ministry International
Institute in Powell, Tennessee; and
WHEREAS, the Reverend Davis is an icon in the civil
rights struggle, facing many challenges in the quest for equal
opportunity, which opened many doors for others; through him a
lawsuit was filed paving the way for the first black sheriff
of Mobile County; he was the first black supply inspector

hired at Brookley Field, the first black supervisor in the

Material Receiving Branch, the first to integrate the
all-white cafeteria at Brookley Field; following his transfer
to Tinker Air Force Base in Oklahoma City, he became the first
black supervisor in redistribution and marketing; he was
promoted to the position as the first black sub-unit chief,
the first black unit and sections chief in the Material
Receiving Section; and

WHEREAS, following his retirement, he returned to
Mobile and continued his mission for equal opportunity; he has
served on the Dumas Wesley Center Board, which is a Mobile
community organization; he has served as president of the
board for the Interdenominational Ministerial Alliance,
Crichton Millville Civil Organization, and the Axis-Creola
Civic League, and numerous others; and

WHEREAS, the Reverend Davis was the pastor of Milledgeville AME Zion Church in the Owassa Community for twenty years; he is married to the love of his life, the Reverend Doctor Dorothy D. Davis, who is the pastor of Pleasant Grove AME Zion Church; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the Reverend Jeffery L. Davis is heartily commended for his outstanding achievements, and this resolution is offered in highest tribute to him along with best wishes in all future endeavors.
