WHEREAS, along with his writing talent, he was musically gifted, singing in gospel quartets and performing solos at the Ryman Auditorium in Nashville, Tennessee, and on other Southern stages; Mr. Cooley also formed a rock 'n' roll band and for a time he was a radio personality with a loyal following; and

WHEREAS, he leaves to mourn his death his daughter, Constance Lynn Cooley; brother, Paul Payne; sister, Margaret Ann Strickland; four grandchildren; special friends, Gail Gallagher and Patsy Trigg; and his canine companion, Jenny; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Cooley was an accomplished journalist and a valued member of the community; his presence will be greatly missed by all those who were privileged to know him; now therefore.
