Johnson, Sr., and Cordelia Harrell Johnson; he attended 16 17 Langdale School and Marion Military Institute, where he excelled in the classroom and on the gridiron; and 18 WHEREAS, Mr. Johnson graduated from The University 19 of Alabama in 1942 and The University of Alabama School of Law 20 21 in 1947; during his university years, he served in the Student 22 Government Association and joined the ROTC; in addition, he 23 was the only person to serve two different terms as president 24 of Sigma Alpha Epsilon Fraternity; and 25 WHEREAS, when World War II broke out, he left law 26 school and joined the United States Army, serving with 27 distinction in both the European and Pacific Theaters; his

duties ranged from platoon leader to defense attorney,
 prosecutor, and commandant of a prison camp; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Johnson returned to law school in 1946 and after graduating became the first lawyer to open his office in Lanett, Alabama; from 1947 until retirement in 1990, he tried landmark cases expanding the rights of property owners in condemnation cases and set records for the largest jury verdicts in Chambers County; and

9 WHEREAS, elected to the State Senate in 1950, he 10 sponsored a variety of legislative acts including requiring increased funding for African-American children attending 11 12 Alabama schools; Mr. Johnson is also credited with the 13 creation of Chambers County Lake, among other achievements; he 14 was deeply committed to the cause of public education and in both the 1951 and 1953 sessions introduced legislation to 15 provide funding for schools in Chambers County; and 16

WHEREAS, in 1954, he founded First Federal Savings and Loan Association, now CharterBank, with the vision of encouraging home ownership, and he was instrumental in establishing The Charter Foundation in 1994, a private foundation that provides grants in the area; in 1963, he founded Citizens National Bank; and

WHEREAS, among his many roles of community
leadership, he played a key role in establishing the George H.
Lanier Memorial Hospital, the first hospital in the nation
funded under the Hill-Burton Act, and the Chambers County
Bradshaw Library, serving as a longtime member on both boards

1 as well as being instrumental in the passage of constitutional 2 amendments to fund libraries and public hospitals in Chambers 3 County; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Johnson was also one of the organizers
and served as attorney for the City of Valley; East Alabama
Water, Sewer, and Fire Protection District; Lee-Chambers Water
District; and Home Federal and Loan Association; and

8 WHEREAS, a scholarship at The University of Alabama 9 bears his name; he was an avid supporter of The University of 10 Alabama, Auburn University, the University of Georgia, 11 LaGrange College, and Stetson University; he was also a 12 lifelong member and supporter of the Langdale United Methodist 13 Church; and

14 WHEREAS, he is survived by his devoted wife of more 15 than 60 years, Elsie B. Johnson; three sons, John W. Johnson, III, Robert L. Johnson, and Curt M. Johnson; two 16 17 daughters-in-law, Tracey Johnson and Lydia Johnson; grandchildren, Andrew Johnson, Franklin Johnson, Helen 18 Johnson, Andrew Coody, Skye Coody, Chauncey Johnson, John Will 19 Johnson, Kit Johnson, and Evan Johnson; sister, Marie 20 Cunningham; brother-in-law, Fletcher Sheriff; sisters-in-law, 21 22 Leila Sheriff and Betty Johnson; five nieces, Cordelia 23 Patterson, Patsy Porter, Susan Ennis, Cathy Goshen, and Denise 24 Porter; and one nephew, Chan Brinson; and
