1 2 3 HR RECOGNIZING FEBRUARY 11, 2024, AS STOMPING OUT ALS DAY 4 5 AND COMMENDING EMMA TERRY FOR HER EFFORTS TOWARD ALS 6 AWARENESS. 7 8 WHEREAS, amytrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS) is a 9 progressive neurodegenerative disease that affects nerve 10 cells in the brain and spinal cord; and WHEREAS, the life expectancy following diagnosis of 11 ALS is between two and five years, and it occurs throughout 12 the world with no racial, ethnic, gender, or socioeconomic 13 14 boundaries; the cause of ALS is unknown in up to 90 percent 15 of cases; and WHEREAS, it is estimated that tens of thousands of 16 17 individuals in the United States have ALS at any given time, and it is estimated that the number of ALS cases around the 18 world is expected to increase by 70 percent between 2015 and 19 2040; and 20 21 WHEREAS, the majority of individuals with ALS die of 22 respiratory failure, and currently there is no cure for ALS; Emma Terry, Miss Jefferson County and the first runner-up in 23 24 the 2023 Miss Alabama Pageant, has made it her platform and 25 mission to increase awareness of the urgent need to develop 26 new treatments for ALS; and 27 WHEREAS, Miss Terry's first-hand experience with the disease inspired her platform for Miss Alabama, Stomping Out 28



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ALS One Step at a Time; during the summers, she assists her grandmother in caring for her grandfather, who is bedridden with ALS; and

32 WHEREAS, Miss Terry believes that a Stomping Out ALS 33 Day in Alabama will bring awareness of this disease and 34 encourage others to get involved in the movement to defeat 35 ALS; she has chosen February 11th as a day of recognition 36 because it is her grandfather's birthday; she is inspired by 37 him, his resilience, and his ongoing battle with ALS; and

38 WHEREAS, Miss Terry encourages people to take small 39 steps to defeat ALS by donating to ALS fundraisers, taking 40 part in social media challenges, and participating in the 41 Walk to Defeat ALS; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, That we commend Miss Emma Terry for her efforts toward ALS awareness, and we recognize February 11, 2024, as Stomping out ALS Day in the State of Alabama and commend its observance to all citizens.
