WHEREAS, she was a member of Delta Sigma Theta
Sorority, Incorporated, and was inducted into the Alabama
Educational Leadership Hall of Fame at Troy University in
1992; among her additional honors and recognitions were:

Among School Administrators; Outstanding Soror of the Year,

Alumna in Education; and Distinguished Service Award,
