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8	RECOGNIZING JANUARY AS MENTORING MONTH IN THE STATE
9	OF ALABAMA.
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11	WHEREAS, the month of January has been designated
12	annually as National Mentoring Month; and
13	WHEREAS, mentoring is a long-standing tradition in
14	which a dependable, caring adult provides guidance, support,
15	and encouragement to facilitate a young person's social,
16	emotional, and cognitive development; and
17	WHEREAS, continued research on mentoring shows that
18	formal, high quality mentoring that focuses on developing the
19	competence and character of the individual who is being
20	mentored promotes positive outcomes, such as improved academic
21	achievement, self-esteem, social skills, and career
22	development; and
23	WHEREAS, additional research provides strong
24	evidence that mentoring successfully reduces substance use and
25	abuse, academic failure, and delinquency; and

1 WHEREAS, mentoring, in addition to preparing young 2 people for school, work, and life, is extremely rewarding for those who serve as mentors; and 3 4 WHEREAS, Big Brothers Big Sisters is a mentoring organization founded more than 100 years ago to address the 5 6 problems of juvenile delinquency and the problems faced by 7 at-risk children throughout the nation; and WHEREAS, Alabama has eight Big Brothers Big Sisters 8 agencies across the state: Greater Birmingham, North Alabama, 9 10 the Shoals, Northeast Alabama, West Alabama, South Central Alabama, South Alabama, and Morgan, Lawrence, Cullman, and 11 12 Winston Counties; and these agencies served more than 3,500 children in Alabama in 2009; and 13 14 WHEREAS, the vision for Big Brothers Big Sisters of 15 Alabama is successful mentoring relationships for all children who need and want them, contributing to better schools, 16 17 brighter futures, and stronger communities for all; and WHEREAS, in spite of progress made to increase 18 mentoring, there is still a serious "mentoring gap"; and 19 20 WHEREAS, mentoring partnerships between the public 21 and private sectors bring state and local leaders together to 22 support mentoring programs, by preventing duplication of 23 efforts, offering training in the best industry practices, and 24 making the most of limited resources to benefit young people; 25 and 26 WHEREAS, a monthlong celebration of mentoring will 27 help call attention to the critical role that mentors play in

helping young people realize their potential, as well as
encourage more individuals and organizations, including
schools, businesses, nonprofit organizations, faith
institutions, and foundations, to become engaged in mentoring
in Alabama; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of this body that the Big Brothers Big Sisters agencies of Alabama be recognized for their commitment in service to the children of Alabama; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, That in highest commendation of Big Brothers Big Sisters of Alabama, and in recognition of outstanding volunteerism throughout the year, we hereby acknowledge January as Mentoring Month in Alabama, and do further direct that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to each of the eight Big Brothers Big Sisters agencies in Alabama.
