13	signed the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) into law on
14	July 26, 1990; and
15	WHEREAS, the intent of the ADA law was to ensure the

17	clear and comprehensive national mandate for the elimination
18	of discrimination against individuals with disabilities; and
19	WHEREAS, the ADA has expanded opportunities for
20	Americans with disabilities by reducing barriers, changing
21	perceptions, and increasing full participation in community
22	life; and
23	WHEREAS, disability is a natural part of the human
24	experience and in no way diminishes the rights of individuals
25	with disabilities to live independently, enjoy
26	self-determination, make choices, contribute to society, and

fully experience the economic, political, social, cultural, and educational mainstream of American society; and

WHEREAS, the concept of cross-disabilities coming together to celebrate our achievements is a new one, but a concept that has grown out of necessity for each disability group to bond and respond as one voice throughout the state; and

WHEREAS, family members, friends, and members of the community play a central role in enhancing the lives of people with disabilities, especially when the family and community are provided the necessary support services and public and private employers are aware of the capabilities of people with disabilities to be engaged in competitive work in inclusive settings; and

WHEREAS, the goals of this state include providing individuals with disabilities the opportunities and support to make informed choices and decisions; live in homes and communities where they can exercise their full rights and responsibilities as citizens; pursue meaningful and productive lives; contribute to their family, community, state, and nation; have interdependent friendships and relationships with others; and achieve full inclusion in society; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, That we hereby recognize March 8, 2012, as Alabama Cross-Disabilities Awareness Day in the House of Representatives.
