11 uplift the life and legacy of Bonney B. "Pete" Barlow, who  
12 passed away March 14, 2016, at 74 years of age; and

13 WHEREAS, the passing of Pete Barlow leaves a void in  
14 the lives of his loving family, many friends, and the entire  
15 community, where he was highly regarded; and

16 WHEREAS, Pete Barlow earned widespread admiration  
17 and respect for his distinguished 40-year service as Satsuma's  
18 Chief of Police; he was a worthy exemplar of those brave and

20 and integrity while safeguarding lives and administering the  
21 law; and

22 WHEREAS, Pete Barlow had the distinction of being  
23 the 1972 recipient of the Liberty Bell Award, a testament to

3 Director of 911 Advanced Technology; and

4 WHEREAS, Pete Barlow served as a member of H.E.  
5 Blackwell Masonic Lodge for 54 years and as a member of the  
6 Order of Eastern Star 515; his pastimes included camping,  
7 gardening, and horseback riding; and

8 WHEREAS, Pete Barlow is remembered for his  
9 professionalism, exceptional leadership, attention to detail,  
10 and zealous devotion to law enforcement and the citizens of  
11 Mobile; and

12 WHEREAS, survivors include his beloved and devoted  
13 wife of 45 years, Judy; one son, Mark Barlow; two  
14 grandchildren, Kelly and Alan Barlow; two sisters, Joann  
15 (Lamar) Lucas; Martha (Robert) Dismukes; and one brother,  
16 Marvin Barlow; he is preceded in death by his parents, Frank  
17 and Thera Mae Barlow; and one brother, Edward (Ruby) Barlow;
