Democratic Club, the Fairfield Civic Leagues, and the Corine Chapter 257 of the Order of the Eastern Star; 5 6 through the years, she was a conscientious worker in voter 7 registration and in assisting voters who found it difficult to 8 get to the polls; and

9 WHEREAS, she leaves to mourn her death her beloved 10 and loving husband, Leroy Bias, Sr.; three daughters, Mary 11 Elizabeth Robinson, Leona Bias, and Deborah (William) 12 Ginwright; a brother, Clarence Jones; sister-in-law, Rena 13 Bestor; eight grandchildren, 11 great-grandchildren; four 14 great-great-grandchildren; and a host of additional caring 15 relatives and friends; and
