1 168337-1:n:04/27/2015:JEC/jec LRS2015-1721 2 3 4 5 6 7 COMMENDING OFFICER NOEL HALL OF THE CITY OF 8 BIRMINGHAM POLICE DEPARTMENT AS A NOMINEE FOR THE 2015 ALABAMA 9 10 LEGISLATIVE MEDAL OF HONOR FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT. 11 12 WHEREAS, it is with highest commendation that we 13 recognize Officer Noel Hall of the City of Birmingham Police 14 Department as a nominee for the 2015 Alabama Legislative Medal 15 of Honor for Law Enforcement, Alabama's highest law enforcement award for extraordinary courage in the line of 16 17 duty; and WHEREAS, Officer Hall was off duty shopping inside 18 of a business in Trussville, Alabama, on November 16, 2014, 19 20 when he witnessed two masked gunmen enter the store and heard 21 one of the say, "Open the register, or I will kill you!" 22 Officer Hall immediately drew his off duty weapon and tried to 23 observe the suspect while remaining concealed; he observed 24 another customer and motioned for him to get on the ground and hide; and 25

26 WHEREAS, while Officer Hall was still assessing the 27 situation, he observed a masked male acting as lookout at the front door; when the lookout noticed Officer Hall, Officer
Hall silently pointed his handgun at him, causing him to flee
the scene; Officer Hall then heard the other suspect, who was
still unaware of Officer Hall's presence ask the store clerk
for knowledge of the location of the safe; and

6 WHEREAS, Officer Hall was better able to observe the 7 second suspect, who he realized was holding the store clerk 8 with one hand while holding a handgun to the clerk's head; at 9 this point, Officer Hall felt confronting the suspect would 10 jeopardize the safety of the clerk, the customers, his 11 girlfriend who was also in the store, and the two children 12 sitting in a car at the store entrance; and

13 WHEREAS, Officer Hall continued to monitor the 14 incident from a concealed position, hoping the gunman would 15 obtain the money he was after and leave the store without any 16 violence; however, he noticed that the two children waiting in 17 the car on their father, the customer Officer Hall asked to take cover, were starting to walk into the store; afraid that 18 the gunman would resort to violence if the children entered 19 20 the store, Officer Hall emerged from his place of concealment 21 and confronted the gunman, ordering him to drop the weapon; 22 fortunately, the robber chose to flee out the back door; 23 Officer Hall chased the suspect to ensure he had in fact left the business and returned to the front of the store to secure 24 it in case the suspect tried to double back; and 25

WHEREAS, Trussville Police were notified and quickly
 apprehended the lookout suspect; afterward, they were able to
 identify and apprehend the armed gunman; and

WHEREAS, while off duty, Officer Hall expertly handled a highly dangerous situation despite the limitations of not being equipped with radio communications with fellow law enforcement officers and a ballistic vest; in addition, he had no evidence that the gunman would not shoot him when confronted; and

WHEREAS, Officer Hall demonstrated immense courage, diligence, and quick thinking during a volatile scenario; his loyalty to protect and serve was evidenced though his willingness to make the ultimate sacrifice to preserve lives; and

15 WHEREAS, Officer Hall epitomizes the qualities of 16 those who serve and protect, and he is truly deserving of this 17 distinguished nomination for the Legislative Medal of Honor 18 for Law Enforcement; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, That we hereby recognize and honor Officer Noel Hall as a nominee for the 2015 Legislative Medal of Honor for Law Enforcement and direct that he receive a copy of this resolution as evidence of our admiration and esteem.
