weight room and the girls were forced to work out in uncomfortable locations, such as stairwells and the shower area; the football program also received an unfair portion of the funding donations to the school's athletic department; and the football coaches earned more than the coaches of the other sports; and

WHEREAS, as a result of Coach Murray's efforts, in 2010, the Mobile County School Board adopted a resolution to improve the equity of girls sports to boys sports throughout the county and is endeavoring to meet the needs of all student athletes and provide the equipment, facilities, and pay for all coaches; and

WHEREAS, Coach Murray was uniquely positioned to address and take action against these pervasive biases and to fight against egalitarian norms, working tirelessly to reduce the bias; she believed she had the ability to help achieve equity in girls and boys sports and truly made a difference in the lives of her students; now therefore,

Horton Murray on her dedication to education and student
athletes and her unwavering efforts to equalize girls and boys
