8 RECOGNIZING THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER 2016 AS CHIARI
9 MALFORMATION AWARENESS MONTH.

WHEREAS, it is imperative that we promote advocacy, education, and awareness for a serious neurological disorder known as Chiari Malformation (CM), which affects the well-being of more than 300,000 United States citizens; the increased use of diagnostic imaging reveals that Chiari Malformation may occur much more often than the widely held estimate of the past that stipulated the condition occurs in about one in every 1,000 births; and

WHEREAS, Chiari Malformations are structural defects in the cerebellum, the area of the brain that controls balance; primary Chiari Malformations occur during fetal development as a result of genetic mutations or lack of proper maternal nutrition, and secondary Chiari Malformations occur later in life if spinal fluid is drained excessively from the lumbar or thoracic areas of the spine either due to injury, exposure to harmful substances, or infection; and

WHEREAS, first identified in the 1890's by Austrian pathologist, Professor Hans Chiari, Chiari Malformations are classified into four types according to the severity of the disorder and the parts of the brain that protrude into the spinal canal; and

WHEREAS, many affected by Chiari Malformations fail to exhibit any symptoms and only discover they have the condition during the course of diagnosis or treatment for another disorder; some children born with the disorder may not show symptoms until adolescence or adulthood, if at all; Chiari Malformations occur more often in women than in men; and

WHEREAS, the National Institute of Neurological
Disorders and Stroke of the National Institutes of Health
strives to determine the cause of Chiari Malformations, along
with alternative surgical options, to deliver the most
effective treatment and preventive plans for those affected by
the condition; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, That we hereby recognize the Month of September 2016 as Chiari Malformation Awareness Month, in the State of Alabama, and urge the increase of advocacy, education, and awareness regarding this disorder.
