MOURNING THE DEATH OF CAPTAIN JASON FULLER.

WHEREAS, it is with profound sorrow that we note the death on March 26, 2021, of Captain Jason Fuller, at the age of 47; and

WHEREAS, his passing leaves a void in the lives of his loving family, many friends, and the entire community, where he was highly regarded; and

WHEREAS, Captain Fuller was born on September 28, 1973, to Ray and JoAnn Fuller; and

WHEREAS, around the age of 14, Captain Fuller began serving his community when he became an Explorer with the Valley Police Department; at the age of 21, the Valley Police Department hired him as a full-time officer and sent him to the Alabama Police Academy, where he performed admirably; in 1996, he transferred his service to Camp Hill, Alabama, where he diligently served until 2001 when the Chambers County Sheriff's Office hired him as a Deputy Sheriff; during his career with the Sheriff's Office, he held many positions that included numerous assigned tasks; he was eventually assigned

1 as Department Head over the Solid Waste Division for the  
2 County; his other achievements during his tenure included  
3 serving as Code Enforcement Officer, managing the Chambers  
4 County Land Fill, being elected by his peers as the Fraternal  
5 Order of Police Lodge Number 20 President, being one of the  
6 original SWAT team members of the Chambers County Sheriff's  
7 Office, and being named Commander of the Chambers County  
8 Multi-Jurisdictional SWAT Team and Commander of the Chambers  
9 County Sheriff's Dive Team; he also served as an Investigator  
10 at the Detention Facility; his final accomplishment during his  
11 nearly 21 years of service with the Sheriff's Office was  
12 earning the rank of Captain; and

13 WHEREAS, when Captain Fuller reported to work, he  
14 always had a smile on his face and a positive attitude; he  
15 loved his coworkers, and they loved him in return; and

16 WHEREAS, he loved collecting vintage motorcycles and  
17 won several awards for them; he participated in benefit bike  
18 rides and attended Bike Week in Panama City, Florida, and in  
19 Daytona, Florida; and

20 WHEREAS, Captain Fuller is survived by his parents;  
21 sister, Jessica Yeager (Geoff); and nieces, Hannah Yeager and  
22 Kenly Yeager; and

23 WHEREAS, although his presence will be greatly  
24 missed, the memory of Captain Fuller will be cherished in the  
25 hearts of all who knew and loved him; now therefore,

26 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF  
27 THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, That the death of Captain Jason

1 Fuller is recorded with deep sadness, and this resolution is
