219385-1:n:03/29/2022:LK/ma LSA2022-1111 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 URGING STATE STUDY AND PUBLIC COMMENT IN REGARDS TO 8 9 SPIRIT INFUSED REFRESHMENTS. 10 WHEREAS, a new type of alcoholic beverage has 11 entered the marketplace, consisting of ready-to-drink, low 12 13 alcohol content, canned beverages infused with distilled 14 spirits products; these beverages have been dubbed "spirit 15 infused refreshments"; and 16 WHEREAS, although these beverages are almost 17 indistinguishable from malt beverages that may be sold in 18 grocery stores and convenience stores, they contain distilled spirits products which may legally be sold only in Alcoholic 19 20 Beverage Control Board stores and private package stores, and 21 may only be transported and distributed by the board; and 22 WHEREAS, the combination of public demand for 23 canned, low alcohol content beverages, the number of new 24 brands and labels of these beverages entering the marketplace, 25 and the physical space required for storage and transportation 26 of these beverages places unprecedented demand on the services of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board; for example, 27

distribution of these beverages by the Alcoholic Beverage
Control Board would require construction by the board of an
entirely new warehouse for the sole purpose of storing these
beverages, and would overload the board's current system of
transportation; and

6 WHEREAS, input from all industry stakeholders, as 7 well as the public, is needed to finalize a good and fair 8 marketplace for this new category of beverage; consumers from 9 Alabama want these new products, and it is the responsibility 10 of the state and its regulatory entities to provide for 11 delivery of these products to the public; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH 12 13 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the Alabama Alcoholic Beverage Control Board is urged to study spirit infused refreshments, 14 15 the demand for these products, and any necessary changes in law that may be required to implement a new statutory 16 17 framework for regulation of these beverages; the alcoholic 18 beverage industry, other regulators, and the general public are likewise urged to study these subjects and to deliver 19 20 comments to the board, in a manner established by the board, 21 regarding a proposed regulatory framework for these beverages 22 within the 30 days following enactment of this resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Alabama Alcoholic Beverage Control Board, no later than 14 days following the conclusion of the 30-day comment period set forth within this resolution, is requested to deliver to the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President of the Senate for further distribution to the members of each chamber a copy of its findings and any legislation proposed by the board pursuant to this resolution, as well as any public commentary that the board finds relevant.
