8 CELEBRATING THE LIFE OF MRS. DORIS LEE RAMSEY  
9 WOOD-LITTLETON.

11 WHEREAS, it is with profound sorrow that we note the  
12 death on March 7, 2022, of Mrs. Doris Lee Ramsey  
13 Wood-Littleton of Saraland, Alabama, at the age of 95; and

14 WHEREAS, her passing leaves a void in the lives of  
15 her loving family, many friends, and the entire community,  
16 where she was highly regarded; and

17 WHEREAS, through a sense of compassion and religious  
18 conviction, Mrs. Wood-Littleton founded Home of Grace for  
19 Women, a faith-based recovery clinic for women who suffer from  
20 drug and alcohol abuse, where she passionately and diligently  
21 served as the Executive Director for 50 years; during those  
22 five decades, Mrs. Wood-Littleton empowered and changed the  
23 lives of countless women; in her 1996 book, "Broken But Mended  
24 Again", she wrote, "In the late 1960s, God began to deal with  
25 my heart through scripture in His Word. God revealed a need He  
26 felt I could meet"; during that time, she was a single mother  
27 who ran a daycare center in Saraland, and taking a leap of

1 faith, she ended her lucrative business and started the rehab  
2 facility in her own house, selflessly opening her home to 14  
3 women; in 1978, she found the land that is now the clinic's  
4 present location; her late husband, Reverend Charles  
5 Littleton, led many of the clients to spiritual renewal; and

6 WHEREAS, Mrs. Wood-Littleton was preceded in death  
7 by her husband; and son, Floyd Morell, Jr.; and

8 WHEREAS, she is survived by her daughters, Diane  
9 Helms and Donna Velasquez; grandchildren, Andy Dickson  
10 (Ragan), Melody Pemberton, Greg Eubanks, Jimmy Smith (Wendy),  
11 Kevin Smith (Dodi), and Dori Baier; 11 great-grandchildren;  
12 six great-great-grandchildren; and a host of extended family  
13 members; and

14 WHEREAS, although her presence will be greatly  
15 missed, the memory of Mrs. Wood-Littleton will be cherished in  
16 the hearts of all who knew and loved her; a woman of God, a  
17 mighty warrior, and a pioneer from which numerous churches and  
18 ministries were born, the incredible legacy that she created  
19 continues to live on; now therefore,

20 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF  
21 THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, That the death of Mrs. Doris Lee
