8 MOURNING THE DEATH OF MRS. ROSE MARIE MOORE TAYLOR.

10 WHEREAS, we note the death of Mrs. Rose Marie Moore
11 Taylor with deep sadness and regret; her invaluable life is
12 commended and celebrated with tremendous thanksgiving; and

13 WHEREAS, the passing of Mrs. Taylor leaves a void in
14 the lives of her loving family, many friends, and the entire
15 community, where she was highly regarded; and

16 WHEREAS, Mrs. Taylor was born March 15, 1927, in
17 Mobile, Alabama, to the union of Daniel L. Moore and Marion
18 Moore; she was a graduate of Central High School and earned a
19 Bachelor of Science Degree from Tennessee A and I University,
20 now Tennessee State University, a teacher certification from
21 Tuskegee Institute, now Tuskegee University, and her Master of
22 Education Degree from Alabama State College, now Alabama State
23 University; and

24 WHEREAS, Mrs. Taylor served as a librarian and
25 teacher for more than 40 years, and her love of learning and
26 passion for education was evident; she enriched the lives and
27 minds of countless students in the Mobile County Public School

1 System; she passed her love for language and communication to
2 her nieces, nephews, and youth in her neighborhood and church;
3 she earned the Mobile County Education Award, Alabama
4 Education Association Certificate of Service, Teacher of the
5 Year Award, and Mobile County Public School's Heart of Gold
6 Award and was listed Who's Who in Education; and

7 WHEREAS, she was a lifelong member of State Street
8 AME Zion Church and served as a deaconess, member of the
9 Allen-Boykin Missionary Society, and Chair of the Life Members
10 Council; she received the Outstanding Service Award from the
11 Life Members Council of State Street AME Zion Church and was
12 recently honored by the Jackson District as Legend of Zion;

14 WHEREAS, survivors include her son, Gerald Taylor
15 (Carla); grandson, Marcus E.C. Abram Taylor (Amber); two
16 sisters, Marion Stokes and Alva Stevens (James); two
17 sisters-in-law, Ida B. Taylor and Sarah Taylor; a caring
18 cousin, Eoline Stoudamire; 11 nieces; eight nephews; and many
19 great-nieces and nephews and other family and friends; and

20 WHEREAS, Mrs. Taylor was a valued member of the
21 community; although her presence is greatly missed, her memory
22 is cherished in the hearts and minds of all those who were
23 fortunate enough to know her; now therefore,
