8	death on October 14, 2023, of Clayton Keith Davis, of Ozark,
9	Alabama, at the age of 68; his passing leaves a void in the

31	and Mobile; his firm contracted with Area Agencies on Aging

35	he worked tirelessly with Medicare recipients through the
