22	and Daphne; "Little Charlie," as he was affectionately called,
23	spent his early school years in Daphne; at an early age, he
24	heard and accepted the call to the Gospel Ministry; and
25	WHEREAS, Mr. Lett received Bachelor of Arts and
26	Bachelor of Divinity Degrees from Selma University and a

certificate to teach in public schools from Alabama State
Teachers College; and

WHEREAS, he taught in Baldwin County for ten years, part of which time he served as principal of the Douglasville High School in Bay Minette, Alabama; he taught at Selma University and later received the Doctor of Divinity Degree; finally, he was a recipient of a Doctor of Laws Degree; and

WHEREAS, Reverend Lett pastored churches in Baldwin, Monroe, and Escambia Counties; then he pastored the Green Street Baptist Church in Selma, which was completely renovated and refurbished under his pastorate; his spiritual guidance played a significant role in many lives; and

WHEREAS, Reverend Lett devotedly served as Pastor Emeritus of the Calvary Missionary Baptist Church in Selma, where the Lord greatly blessed his work; and

WHEREAS, he served in numerous capacities including as member and President of the Selma City School Board,
President of the local NAACP, a member of Selma University's
Charter Board of Trustees, President of Selma Interracial
Alliance, Chaplin of Selma City Council, President of
Southwest District State Convention, lifetime member of the
NAACP, a member of the Board of Directors and Vice President
of Citizens Federal Bank in Birmingham, Alabama, Co-chairman
of the Conference of Grand Chapters Prince Hall Affiliated,
Grand Worthy Patron Mizpah of the Grand Chapter Order of
Eastern Star, Executive Secretary of the Alabama Baptist State
