8	COMMENDING ALL CHURCHES TOGETHER IN BALDWIN COUNTY
9	FOR 25 YEARS OF CIVIC ENGAGEMENT AND ESTABLISHING THE FIRST
10	SUNDAY IN NOVEMBER AS ACT-II DAY IN BALDWIN COUNTY.
11	
12	WHEREAS, All Churches Together in Baldwin County,
13	hereinafter known as ACT-II, is a program of the nonprofit
14	organization Ecumenical Ministries, Inc.; and
15	WHEREAS, ACT-II helps volunteers and churches come
16	together to work on systemic problems in several communities
17	around Baldwin County; and
18	WHEREAS, in November 2017, ACT-II will celebrate 25
19	years of civic engagement improving Baldwin County
20	communities, particularly low income communities throughout
21	the county; and
22	WHEREAS, hundreds of ACT-II volunteers and leaders
23	helped the Baldwin County Commission initiate a road paving
24	fairness campaign that resulted in more than 300 miles of
25	rural dirt roads in the county being paved without tax
26	increases; and

1 WHEREAS, the road paving program significantly 2 improved the quality of life and value of personal holdings for hundreds of low-income families; and 3 WHEREAS, ACT-II civic engagement cleaned up a rural water system that often delivered iron-contaminated drinking 5 6 water that was as much as seven times the legal limit while 7 reducing water rates at the same time; and WHEREAS, ACT-II civic engagement led to the 8 9 installation of another water system that now serves hundreds 10 of families in North Baldwin County without increasing taxes; 11 and 12 WHEREAS, an ACT-II initiative brought several 13 nonprofit housing programs together to form Repair Baldwin, 14 which has provided home security, safety, access, and repairs 15 to more than 350 homes in just over three years using 16 volunteers and donations; and 17 WHEREAS, ACT-II civic engagement led to passage of the Property Insurance Clarity Act to the benefit of 18 homeowners; and 19 WHEREAS, Alabama Senate Joint Resolution SJR22 in 20 21 2014 urged "the Gulf Coast counties in Alabama, Alabama's Department of Insurance, and the Alabama Executive Office to 22 23 explore and consider the formation of an Interstate 24 Re-Insurance Coastal Band and/or re-insurance entity," and the 25 ACT-II chapter, commonly known as the Homeowners Hurricane Insurance Initiative (HHII), guided this process, including 26

hosting a multi-state homeowners insurance conference in April 2017; and

WHEREAS, hundreds of ACT-II volunteers, community leaders, and dozens of churches working together have through the past 25 years initiated community improvements too numerous to list, including sidewalks, voting places, police-community partnerships, traffic safety improvements, racial reconciliation affinity groups, and community cleanups; and

WHEREAS, the example set by the volunteers and churches shows how communities can be improved when citizens of all denominations, races, economic status, and political persuasions work together on a common community problem; and WHEREAS, ACT-II was formed in 1992 at the urging of

Bishop Manuel Watson and Ecumenical Ministries, Inc.; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, That we express our sincere and deep appreciation for the founders, Ecumenical Ministries, Inc., and Bishop Manuel Watson and for ACT-II and its tens of thousands of hours of diligent and cooperative work.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the first Sunday in November shall be recognized in perpetuity as ACT-II Day in Baldwin County.
