ROBERT GREEN. 8 9 10 WHEREAS, we note with great sadness the death of Dr. Robert Lawson Green of Daphne, Alabama, at the age of 78 11 12 years; and 13 WHEREAS, he was born on September 26, 1939, in 14 Birmingham, Alabama, to the late Marvin and Frances Green; Dr. 15 Green was valedictorian of his graduating class at Glenn 16 Vocational High School where he studied auto mechanics and he studied electrical engineering at Auburn University; he later 17 received his Doctor of Medicine in 1967 from the Medical 18 College of Alabama in Birmingham, now the UAB School of 19 20 Medicine; and 21 WHEREAS, Dr. Green began his medical residency at 22 University Hospital in Birmingham, Alabama, and completed his residency in neurology at Walter Reed Army Medical Center in 23 24 Washington, D.C., where he was chief resident; he later earned

25 the rank of major and was chief of neurology at Madigan 26 General Hospital at Fort Lewis in Washington state, where he 27 earned an Army Commendation Medal; and

1 WHEREAS, in 1973, Dr. Green and his family moved to 2 Mobile and he became the city's first neurologist; he 3 co-founded the paramedic program in Mobile, served as fire 4 surgeon with the Mobile Fire Department, deputy police surgeon 5 with the Mobile Police Department, and medical disaster 6 consultant for Mobile Regional Airport; and

7 WHEREAS, he was the medical director for the Emergency Management Agency (Civil Defense) and planned and 8 9 coordinated disaster training exercises in Mobile Bay and for 10 the Mobile Regional Airport; among his many professional accomplishments, he established electroencephalography and 11 electro diagnostic labs in several hospitals; he served as the 12 13 director of the head injury unit at Rotary Rehab as well as established and served as the coordinator for the loss 14 15 prevention program at Mobile Infirmary; and

16 WHEREAS, other notable achievements include being 17 the chair of the committee for the Alabama Quality Assurance 18 Foundation, which reviewed and validated all Medicare hospital 19 patient care in the southern region of the state, being a 20 trustee at Providence Hospital, and serving on the board of 21 directors at Springhill Memorial Hospital; and

22 WHEREAS, Dr. Green also held several community 23 outreach initiatives for epilepsy, muscular dystrophy, 24 multiple sclerosis, and myasthenia gravis societies; and

25 WHEREAS, he greatly enjoyed photography, deep sea 26 fishing, computers, Auburn football, and traveling in his 27 motor home around the country with his beloved wife, visiting

every national park they could; he cherished his time with family and enjoyed their annual family ski vacations in Colorado, where his granddaughters hold fond memories of learning to ski; Dr. Green also served as the president of the Mobile Big Game Fishing Club for three years and served as the president of the Loma Alta Towers Owner's Association for six years; and
