16	March 7, 1965, about 600 people began a march from Selma,
17	Alabama, to Montgomery, Alabama, led by John Lewis and Hosea
18	Williams; the marchers demanded an end to discrimination in
19	voter registration; at the Edmund Pettus Bridge, state and
20	local lawmen attack the marchers with billy clubs and tear
21	gas, driving them back to Selma; and
22	WHEREAS, the Selma-to-Montgomery March was a
23	catalyst for passage of the 1965 Voting Rights Act; it is one
24	of the indelible events in civil rights history that shocked

the conscience of America; the Voting Rights Act has resulted

in reducing voter suppression and spurring significant

participation in the voting process by African Americans
throughout the nation; and
