WHEREAS, Mr. Curry was among the journalists who 1 2 founded the Greater St. Louis Association of Black Journalists; in 2003, Mr. Curry was named Journalist of the 3 Year by the National Association of Black Journalists (NABJ); 4 5 he is also on the NABJ's list of Most Influential Black Journalists of the 20th Century; and 6 WHEREAS, Mr. Curry is survived by his sister, Charlotte Purvis; son, Edward Curry; granddaughter, Neyah 8 Curry; and a host of family and friends; and 9 10 WHEREAS, his passion for life will be remembered 11 fondly; Mr. Curry was a valued member of the community and was 12 loved by many; his presence will be greatly missed and his 13 memory will be cherished in the hearts and minds of those who were fortunate to know him; now therefore, 14 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF 15 THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, That the death of George E.
