157 Relating to health care facilities; to add Section 22-21-437
158 to the Code of Alabama 1975; to require health care facilities
159 to adopt certain visitation policies; to provide that patients
160 have a right to certain visitation; to allow patients to
161 designate an essential caregiver and to guarantee that
162 caregiver certain visitation rights; to prohibit a health care
163 facility from adopting a visitation policy that is more
164 stringent than certain employee policies; to prohibit a health
165 care facility from requiring visitors to show proof of
166 vaccination or from prohibiting consensual physical contact
167 between visitors and patients; to provide for the
168 circumstances in which patients may not be denied visitors who
169 are not essential caregivers; to require health care
170 facilities to provide visitation policies to the Department of
171 Public Health; to require the Department of Public Health to
172 develop a mechanism for complaints; to provide certain
173 immunity from liability in certain circumstances; to exempt
174 certain psychiatric care facilities from the provisions of
175 this bill; and to repeal Sections 22-21-430 through 22-21-436,
176 Code of Alabama 1975, relating to hospital visitation during a
177 public health emergency.

230 the first five hundred dollars (\$500) of taxable income for
231 single persons, heads of families, and married persons filing
232 separate returns and would also eliminate the two percent tax
233 rate on the first one thousand dollars (\$1,000) of taxable
234 income for married persons filing a joint return.

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
