11	WHEREAS, we note the death of Bishop Dr. George
12	Washington Ayers with deep sadness and regret; his invaluable
13	life is commended and celebrated with tremendous thanksgiving;

15	WHEREAS, Bishop Ayers was born November 24, 1927, in
16	Maben, Alabama, to the union of Lester and Rosie Ayers; he
17	graduated from Parker High School in Birmingham, Alabama, in
18	1945; in 1946, he married his beloved and devoted wife, Verley
19	Mildred Smith; their blissful union was truly an "Apostolic
20	Love Story" that spanned almost seven decades; and
21	WHEREAS, Bishop Ayers served with much honor and
22	distinction in the United States Army during World War II and
23	was awarded a Purple Heart while wounded on the Island of
24	Guam; and
25	WHEREAS, Bishop Ayers earned his Bachelor of Arts
26	Degree in Business and the Alumni Merit Award with honors from
27	Booker T. Washington Business College in Birmingham, Alabama,

his TH.B. Degree from the Bethel School of Theology in

Detroit, Michigan, his Master of Theology Degree from

Maranatha Bible College in Union, South Carolina, his Doctor of Divinity and Doctor of Letters Degrees from the

International Bible Institute and Seminary in Orlando,

Florida, his Doctorate of Theology in 1990, and his Ph.D. in

Theology in 1994; and

WHEREAS, Bishop Ayers united with the Apostolic Overcoming Holy Church of God, Inc., under the leadership of his spiritual father, the late Bishop Jasper Roby, at the 17th Street A.O.H. Church of God; and

WHEREAS, Bishop Ayers was called into the ministry in 1950; over the years, he pastored churches including an A.O.H. Church in Tuskegee, Alabama, the Pratt City A.O.H. Church, the Phillips Temple A.O.H. Church of God in Mobile, Alabama, Faith Tabernacle A.O.H. Church of God in Richmond, California, and Cathedral of the Cross/New Jerusalem A.O.H. Church of God in Birmingham, Alabama; he and his wife established the first A.O.H. Church in California; and

WHEREAS, Bishop Ayers was appointed an Overseer and became a member of the Executive Board of the A.O.H. Church of God, which he served for 59 years, and he was consecrated to the office of Bishop in the A.O.H. Church of God; he had the distinction of being the only living Bishop that was consecrated by the founder, Bishop William Thomas Phillips; in 2000, he was elected as the International Presiding Prelate of

the A.O.H. Church of God, Inc., by the National Executive
Board; and

WHEREAS, Bishop Ayers untiringly worked in the City of Richmond and founded the Western Regional Bible College, Western Regional Christian Academy Grades K-12, and the Faith Tabernacle Child Care and Learning Center; in addition, he spearheaded the renovation and modification of the Saints Home in Mobile, Alabama, and devised plans to purchase the \$24 million Cathedral of the Cross; and

WHEREAS, on March 3, 2015, the day before his passing, the Mobile City Council voted unanimously to name a street in his honor; and

WHEREAS, survivors include a devoted and loving daughter and son, La Tanja Ayers-Davis and Overseer Reginald Davis; three caring grandchildren, Ephraim Lamar, George Washington, and Octavia Faith; one brother, Eddie Ayers (Delores); three sisters-in-law, Pauline Anderson, Marilyn Anderson, and Mary Cooley Ayers; and a host of nieces, nephews, other relatives, god-children, god-grandchildren, and friends; and

WHEREAS, Bishop Ayers was a valued member of the community; although his presence is greatly missed, his memory is cherished in the hearts and minds of all those who were fortunate enough to know him; now therefore,
