Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, is proposed and shall become valid as a part thereof when approved by a majority of the qualified electors voting thereon and in accordance with Sections 284, 285, and 287 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended:

PROPOSED AMENDMENT

Notwithstanding Sections 284 and 285, and Amendments 425 and 555 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, and any other law to the contrary, any proposed statewide or local constitutional amendment, any referendum proposed by state or local law, and any referendum called by the state or by a county, municipality, or other local governing body shall be submitted to the voters at either a statewide primary election or statewide general election.

Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 284 and 285 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this state.

Section 3. The appropriate election official shall assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the
