 Medical Examiners may enter into a collaborative practice
 agreement.

5 (b) A copy of the collaborative practice agreement 6 and any amendment thereto shall be submitted to each 7 respective board within 10 days after the agreement is signed 8 by both parties.

9 (c) A collaborative practice agreement and any 10 amendment thereto shall not become effective until received by 11 the Board of Pharmacy and the Board of Medical Examiners.

12 (d) The Board of Pharmacy and the Board of Medical13 Examiners may each adopt rules to implement this act.

(e) Nothing in this section shall preclude a
pharmacist licensed by the State Board of Pharmacy employed by
a licensed healthcare facility from executing approved medical
protocols within the facility.

Section 2. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.

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
