187954-1:n:08/28/2017:KMS/th LRS2017-2800 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 The Alabama Memorial Preservation Act of 8 SYNOPSIS: 9 2017 prohibits certain schools located on public 10 property and erected for, or named or dedicated in 11 honor of, an event, a person, a group, a movement, 12 or military service, from being renamed. 13 This bill would remove the prohibition 14 against the renaming of those schools and would 15 specifically exempt all preK-12, postsecondary, and higher education institutions and facilities from 16 17 the Alabama Memorial Preservation Act of 2017. 18 19 A BILL 20 TO BE ENTITLED 21 AN ACT 22 To amend Sections 2, 3, 4, 6, and 7 of Act 2017-354, 23 24 2017 Regular Session, now appearing as Sections 41-9-231, 41-9-232, 41-9-233, 41-9-235, and 41-9-236, Code of Alabama 25 26 1975, relating to the Alabama Memorial Preservation Act of

2017, to specifically exempt all preK-12, postsecondary, and 1 2 higher education institutions and facilities from the act. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: 3 Section 1. Sections 2, 3, 4, 6, and 7 of Act 4 2017-354, 2017 Regular Session, now appearing as Sections 5 41-9-231, 41-9-232, 41-9-233, 41-9-235, and 41-9-236, Code of 6 7 Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows: "§41-9-231. 8 "For the purposes of this article, the following 9 10 terms shall have the following meanings: "(1) ARCHITECTURALLY SIGNIFICANT BUILDING. A 11 building located on public property that by its very nature, 12 13 inherent design, or structure constitutes a monument. "(2) COMMITTEE. The Committee on Alabama Monument 14 Protection created by this article. 15 "(3) MEMORIAL SCHOOL. A K-12 or two-year 16 postsecondary institution or facility that is located on 17 18 public property and has been erected for, or named or 19 dedicated in honor of, an event, a person, a group, a 20 movement, or military service. "(3) (4) MEMORIAL BUILDING. A building, structure, 21 22 park, or other institution, other than a Memorial School, that 23 is located on public property and has been erected for, or 24 named or dedicated in honor of, an event, a person, a group, a 25 movement, or military service.

26 "<u>(4) (5)</u> MEMORIAL STREET. A street that is located on
 27 public property and has been constructed for, or named or

dedicated in honor of, an event, a person, a group, a
 movement, or military service.

3 "(5) (6) MONUMENT. A statue, portrait, or marker intended at the time of dedication to be a permanent memorial 4 5 to an event, a person, a group, a movement, or military service that is part of the history of the people or geography 6 7 now comprising the State of Alabama. The term does not include signage bearing historical or interpretive text, commonly 8 known as a historical marker or wayside exhibit, or portraits 9 10 or plaques installed by temporary means and not intended to be 11 permanent at the time of installation.

12 "<u>(6)(7)</u> PUBLIC PROPERTY. All property owned or 13 leased by the State of Alabama; any county, municipal, or 14 metropolitan government in the state; or any other entity 15 created by act of the Legislature to perform any public 16 function.

18 "(a) No architecturally significant building, 19 memorial building, memorial street, or monument which is 20 located on public property and has been so situated for 40 or 21 more years may be relocated, removed, altered, renamed, or 22 otherwise disturbed.

"(b) No architecturally significant building, memorial building, memorial street, or monument which is located on public property and has been so situated for at least 20 years, and less than 40 years, may be relocated, removed, altered, renamed, or otherwise disturbed except as
 provided in Section 41-9-235.

"(c) No memorial school which is located on public
 property and has been so situated for 20 or more years may be
 renamed except as provided in Section 41-9-235.

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"§41-9-233.

"No person may prevent the governmental entity
having responsibility for maintaining any architecturally
significant building, memorial building, memorial school,
memorial street, or monument from taking proper and
appropriate measures, and exercising proper and appropriate
means, for the protection, preservation, care, repair, or
restoration of those monuments, streets, or buildings.

"(a) (1) Any entity exercising control of public property on which an architecturally significant building, memorial building, memorial school, memorial street, or monument is located may petition the committee for a waiver from subsection (b) or subsection (c) of Section 41-9-232 through an application including, at a minimum, all of the following:

"a. A resolution by the controlling entity seeking a waiver for the renaming of a memorial school or for the relocation, removal, alteration, renaming, or other disturbance of the architecturally significant building, memorial building, memorial street, or monument and the reasons therefor. "b. Written documentation of the origin of the architecturally significant building, memorial building, memorial school, memorial street, or monument, the intent of the sponsoring entity at the time of dedication, and any subsequent alteration, renaming, or other disturbance of the architecturally significant building, memorial building, memorial street, or monument.

8 "c. Written commentary from any heritage, 9 historical, genealogical, or preservation organizations with 10 interest in the decision of the controlling entity, and from 11 the general public.

"d. A written statement of any facts that were not known at the time of the origin of the architecturally significant building, memorial building, memorial school, memorial street, or monument, but are known now, that the committee should consider in granting the waiver. The absence of such facts should serve as a presumption against the granting of a waiver by the committee.

19 "(2)(a) If the committee grants a waiver, the 20 committee may provide reasonable conditions and instructions 21 to ensure that the architecturally significant building, 22 memorial building, memorial school, memorial street, or 23 monument is restored or preserved to the greatest extent 24 possible.

25 "(b) In the event there is a need for emergency 26 repairs or construction at the site of or to the 27 architecturally significant building, memorial building,

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memorial street, or monument or on adjacent property, the 1 2 controlling entity may temporarily relocate or otherwise protect the architecturally significant building, memorial 3 building, memorial street, or monument without seeking a 4 5 waiver under the process provided in this section; provided the architecturally significant building, memorial building, 6 7 memorial street, or monument shall be returned to its prior location or condition, or both, as soon as safely and 8 reasonably possible, and no later than one year after the 9 10 completion of the repair or construction. If the repair or 11 construction is expected to take more than one year, the 12 controlling entity shall seek a waiver under the process 13 specified in this section.

14 "(c) If the committee fails to act on a completed 15 application for a waiver within 90 days after the application 16 is submitted to the committee, the waiver shall be deemed 17 granted.

18 "(d) If the Attorney General determines that an 19 entity exercising control of public property has renamed a 20 memorial school or has relocated, removed, altered, renamed, or otherwise disturbed an architecturally significant 21 22 building, memorial building, memorial street, or monument from 23 that public property without first obtaining a waiver from the 24 committee as required by this article, or failed to comply 25 with the conditions and instructions issued by the committee 26 upon the grant of a waiver pursuant to this section, the 27 entity shall be fined twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000)

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for each violation. The fine shall be collected by the 1 2 Attorney General, forwarded by his or her office to the State 3 Treasurer, and deposited into the Alabama State Historic Preservation Fund created in Section 41-9-255. 4 5 "(e) Judicial review of the final decision of the committee may be sought pursuant to the Alabama Administrative 6 Procedure Act, Chapter 22 of this title. 7 "§41-9-236. 8 "This article does not apply to any of the 9 10 following: "(1) Art and artifacts in the collections of 11 12 museums, archives, and libraries. 13 "(2) Any architecturally significant building, memorial building, memorial street, or monument that is any of 14 the following: 15 16 "a. Located on public property under the control of, 17 or acquired by, the State Department of Transportation, which 18 may interfere with the construction, maintenance, or operation 19 of the public transportation system. The department shall 20 strive to ensure that any architecturally significant building, memorial building, memorial street, or monument is 21 22 preserved to the greatest extent possible. "b. Located on public property under the control of, 23 24 or acquired by, a county or municipal body or a university, 25 which may interfere with the construction, maintenance, or 26 operation of the public transportation system. The governing 27 body of the county, municipality, or university shall strive

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to ensure that any architecturally significant building, memorial building, memorial street, or monument is preserved to the greatest extent possible.

4 "c. Located on public property operated or used by a
5 utility, which may interfere with providing utility service.
6 The utility shall strive to ensure that any architecturally
7 significant building, memorial building, memorial street, or
8 monument is preserved to the greatest extent possible.

9 "d. Located on public property under the control of, 10 or acquired by, the Alabama State Port Authority, which may 11 interfere with the construction, maintenance, or operation of 12 the port infrastructure or port related activities. The 13 authority shall strive to ensure that any architecturally 14 significant building, memorial building, memorial street, or 15 monument is preserved to the greatest extent possible.

16 "e. Located on public property under the control of, 17 or acquired by, a local board of education, the Board of 18 Trustees of the Alabama Community College System, or governing 19 body or governing board of trustees of any preK-12, two-year 20 postsecondary, or four-year institution of higher education. The governing board or body shall strive to ensure that any 21 22 architecturally significant building, memorial building, 23 memorial street, or monument is preserved to the greatest 24 extent possible."

25 Section 2. This act shall become effective 26 immediately following its passage and approval by the 27 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
