21	Section 1. The following amendment to the

24	majority of the qualified electors voting thereon and in		
25	accordance with Sections 284, 285, and 287 of the Constitution		
26	of Alabama of 1901, as amended:		
27	PROPOSED AMENDMENT		

(a) Section 256 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended by Amendment 111, is amended to read as follows:

"Section 256. It is the policy of the state of Alabama to foster and promote the education of its citizens in a manner and extent consistent with its available resources, and the willingness and ability of the individual student, but nothing in this Constitution shall be construed as creating or recognizing any right to education or training at public expense, nor as limiting the authority and duty of the legislature, in furthering or providing for education, to require or impose conditions or procedures deemed necessary to the preservation of peace and order.

"The legislature may by law provide for or authorize the establishment and operation of schools by such persons, agencies or municipalities, at such places, and upon such conditions as it may prescribe, and for the grant or loan of public funds and the lease, sale or donation of real or personal property to or for the benefit of citizens of the state for educational purposes under such circumstances and upon such conditions as it shall prescribe. Real property owned by the state or any municipality shall not be donated for educational purposes except to nonprofit charitable or eleemosynary corporations or associations organized under the laws of the state.

"To avoid confusion and disorder and to promote effective and economical planning for education, the

1 legislature may authorize the parents or quardians of minors, 2 who desire that such minors shall attend schools provided for their own race, to make election to that end, such election to 3 be effective for such period and to such extent as the 5 legislature may provide." (b) Article XIV, Section 259, relating to poll tax 6 7 revenues, is repealed. (c) Amendment 90 relating to exemptions from the 8 9 poll tax is repealed. 10 (d) Amendment 109 relating to exemptions from the 11 poll tax is repealed. 12 Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the 13 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election 14 15 laws of this state. Section 3. The appropriate election official shall 16 17 assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the 18 following description of the substance or subject matter of 19 the proposed constitutional amendment: 20 21 "Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of 22 Alabama of 1901, to repeal portions of Amendment 111, now 23 appearing as Section 256 of the Official Recompilation of the 24 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, relating to 25 separation of schools by race and to repeal Section 259, 26 Amendment 90, and Amendment 109, relating to the poll tax. "Proposed by Act ."
