Under existing law, termination dates are 8 SYNOPSIS: 9 established for enumerated state agencies. The 10 agencies are periodically reviewed by the Alabama 11 Sunset Committee. After the review process is 12 completed, the committee prepares its 13 recommendations for the agencies to the Legislature 14 in the form of sunset bills which either continue, 15 terminate, or continue with modifications each 16 agency reviewed.

This bill would provide for the continuance of the Board of Examiners of Mine Personnel until October 1, 2016, with the following change: To allow the board to charge a reasonable fee for the examination for a certificate of competency to act as mine foremen or fire boss.

24 A BILL 25 TO BE ENTITLED 26 AN ACT Relating to the Alabama Sunset Law; to continue the existence and functioning of the Board of Examiners of Mine Personnel until October 1, 2016, with certain modifications; to amend Section 25-9-10, Code of Alabama 1975, so as to allow the board to charge a reasonable fee for the examination for a certificate of competency to act as mine foremen or fire boss. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

9 Section 1. Pursuant to the Alabama Sunset Law, the 10 Sunset Committee recommends the continuance of the Board of 11 Examiners of Mine Personnel until October 1, 2016, with the 12 additional recommendation for statutory change as set out in 13 Section 3.

14 Section 2. The existence and functioning of the 15 Board of Examiners of Mine Personnel, created and functioning 16 pursuant to Sections 25-9-8 to 25-9-18, inclusive, Code of 17 Alabama 1975, is continued until October 1, 2016, and those 18 code sections are expressly preserved.

Section 3. Section 25-9-10 of the Code of Alabama
1975, is amended to read as follows:

"§25-9-10.

"The board of examiners created by Section 25-9-9 shall examine qualified applicants and give certificates of competency to persons who pass the required examinations to act as mine foremen or fire bosses in any coal mine in this state. A <u>reasonable</u> fee to be, as established by the board,

not to exceed \$20.00, shall be charged for each examination 1 2 given by the board, and such fee shall be paid to the Treasury of the state before the examination is begun. The examinations 3 4 shall be conducted under such uniform rules, conditions, and 5 regulations as the board shall deem most efficient for 6 carrying into effect the spirit and intent of this chapter. 7 Such rules, when formulated, shall be made a part of the permanent record of the board, and such of them as relate to 8 9 candidates shall be published for their information and 10 governance prior to each examination. Such rules shall be of 11 uniform application to all candidates."

12 Section 4. The Legislature concurs in the 13 recommendations of the Sunset Committee as provided in 14 Sections 1, 2, and 3.

Section 5. This act shall become effective immediately upon its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
