8 SYNOPSIS:

Currently, there is no law providing for the continuation of the office of President Pro
Tempore of the Senate for the period of time between the statewide general election in the fourth year of a legislative quadrennium and the ensuing organizational session of the newly elected Legislature if the currently serving President Pro
Tempore is not reelected.

This bill wold provide that a serving

President Pro Tempore who is reelected at the

general election would continue to serve in that

capacity until the succeeding organizational

session. The bill would provide that if a serving

President Pro Tempore ceases to be a member of the

Senate for any reason prior to the election of a

President Pro Tempore at an organizational session,

the member of the Senate elected to the Legislative

Council with the longest service as a member of the

Senate would serve as President Pro Tempore until a

President Pro Tempore is elected by the Senate.

Relating to the office of President Pro Tempore of the Senate; to provide that a person serving as President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall continue to serve in that capacity from the date of the general election at which Senate members are elected to a new four-year term until the ensuing organizational session, if that person is reelected at the general election; and that if a serving President Pro Tempore is not reelected at the general election, or if a serving President Pro Tempore ceases to be a member of the Senate for any reason, the member of the Senate elected to the Legislative Council with the longest service as a member of the Senate shall serve as President Pro Tempore until the Senate elects a President Pro Tempore.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) If the senator who is serving as the President Pro Tempore of the Senate on the date of the general election at which members of the Senate are elected to four-year terms is reelected to the Senate, the senator shall continue to serve as President Pro Tempore of the Senate until a successor President Pro Tempore is selected pursuant to Section 48.01 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended.

1 (b) If the senator serving as President Pro Tempore 2 of the Senate ceases to be a member of the Senate for any reason prior to election of a President Pro Tempore pursuant 3 to Section 48.01 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, then the member 5 6 of the Senate elected to the Legislative Council with the 7 longest service as a member of the Senate shall serve as the President Pro Tempore until a successor President Pro Tempore 8 is elected pursuant to Section 48.01 of the Official 9 10 Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as 11 amended.

(c) When a member of the Senate is serving as

President Pro Tempore pursuant to subsection (b), for purposes

of Section 48.01 of the Official Recompilation of the

Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, only, there is a

vacancy in the office of President Pro Tempore that may be

filled by election of the Senate.

Section 2. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
