23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
24	Section 1. The monies in Section 2 are appropriated
25	from the named funds for the 2017 fiscal year to the state
26	agencies indicated, as the amounts to be used to pay the
27	expenditures of the named agencies, and are in lieu of all

monies appropriated for these purposes in other sections of
 the Alabama Statutes.

For the purpose of this act, the amounts herein for expenditures are listed by programmatic area and the totals for all programs are shown by the source of funds. It is intended that only the herein named funds be appropriated in the amounts specified to the named agencies and that the following definitions shall be applicable.

9 "Appropriation Total" shall mean the aggregate total 10 of all fund sources.

"Program" shall mean specific governmental services required to achieve a specific objective. A program shall be directed to meeting the need of an identified clientele, or group of recipients or beneficiaries, and shall be expended only for such purposes.

16 "Capital Outlay" shall mean expenditures which 17 result in the acquisition and/or addition to items, such as 18 land or buildings, which have an appreciable and calculable 19 period of usefulness in excess of one year, and shall be 20 expended only for such purposes.

"Debt Service" shall mean an expenditure for the payment of interest and principal on bonded debt obligations of the State, and shall be expended only for such purposes.

24 "Federal and Local Funds" shall mean all gifts,
25 grants, contributions, or entitlements, including grants by
26 the Congress of the United States, municipalities or counties.

Section 2. There is hereby appropriated 1 2 the amounts set forth herein for the ordinary expenses of the executive, legislative, and judicial agencies of the State, 3 for other functions of government, for debt service, and for 4 5 capital outlay for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2017, to be paid out of any monies hereinafter specified, from such 6 7 other funds and accounts as may be designated, or so much thereof as may be necessary, and the total amount to be ex-8 pended for the items for which the appropriation is herein 9 10 made shall not exceed the amount provided therefor, except as 11 provided in the Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 12 41-19-1 through 41-19-12, Code of Alabama 1975. Provided, how-13 ever, that regardless of the ending date of any pay period which has been or may be established by the Legislature for 14 the payment of salaries of state employees, the entire payment 15 due shall be made from the fiscal year's appropriation in 16 which the pay date falls. 17

Section 3. In addition to the amounts otherwise 1 2 appropriated in this act, there is hereby appropriated from the several funds in the State Treasury, except the Education 3 4 Trust Fund, and in the same proportion as the salaries of the 5 several State officials and employees are paid, such additional amounts as may be necessary to pay for a two 6 7 percent (2.0%) salary increase enacted in the 2016 Regular 8 Session. The additional amounts appropriated in this section 9 from the State General Fund shall not exceed \$10,000,000 for 10 the fiscal year ending September 30, 2017. 10 Section 10. The Department of Examiners of Public 11 Accounts is hereby authorized to examine as deemed necessary 12 all appropriations herein made for compliance with the laws of 13 the State of Alabama. Any examination performed shall be in accordance with the provisions of Title 41, Chapter 5, Code of 14 15 Alabama 1975. It is the intent of the Legislature that all 16 state agencies cooperate with the Examiners of Public Accounts to provide the information necessary to conduct recovery 17 audits as provided for in Section 41-5-6.1, Code of Alabama 18 1975. 19

20 Section 11. Upon certification to the Director of 21 Finance by the State Attorney General that a federal court has 22 ordered the State of Alabama to pay claims, attorney fees, or 23 other costs relating to said court order, funds are hereby 24 appropriated to the affected department, board, bureau, or 25 commission from the appropriate fund or funds of such 26 department, board, bureau or commission in the amount 27 necessary to satisfy that court order. Such appropriations are

in addition to any other appropriation heretofore or hereafter
made in this appropriation act. Such appropriations are
conditioned upon the availability of funds and a determination
by the Director of Finance that existing appropriations are
not available for the court-ordered payments.

Section 12. All interest earned from funds paid into 6 7 Account No. 0396 by Act 87-761, Act 88-947, Act 89-79, Act 90-556 and Act 91-572 are hereby appropriated to the 8 Governor's Contingency Fund to be spent at the discretion of 9 10 the Governor. Any other interest earned by the state from 11 Revenue Sharing Investments under the State and Local Fiscal 12 Assistance Act of 1972, as amended, Public Law 92-512, 92nd Congress, together with any accruals or reversions thereon are 13 hereby appropriated to the State General Fund. 14

Section 13. All encumbered balances of a previous 15 16 fiscal year appropriation, other than the exclusions 17 authorized by this Act or in Section 41-4-93, Code of Alabama 18 1975, shall lapse no later than September 30 of the fiscal 19 year immediately following the fiscal year for which the 20 appropriation was made and shall revert to the credit of the State General Fund or earmarked fund from which the 21 22 appropriation or appropriations were made.

23 Section 14. The appropriations made herein to the 24 departments, boards, offices, commissions and agencies include 25 the amounts necessary, and said departments, boards, offices, 26 commissions and agencies are hereby directed to make the 27 transfer of funds to the State Personnel Department in said amounts enumerated in this act. All agencies enumerated in this act and receiving services from other governmental agencies enumerated in this act shall make full payment in a timely manner (as determined by the Department of Finance) for such services.

6 Section 15. All funds collected under Section 7 40-12-43.1 between the effective date of Act 98-191 and 8 September 30, 2016 are hereby appropriated to the Auburn 9 University Center for Governmental Services for the 10 administration of the examiner certification program 11 established by the Alabama Local Tax Institute of Standards 12 and Training as provided in Section 40-12-43.1.

13 Section 16. In addition to all other appropriations, 14 the first \$50,000,000 in funds received by the state in fiscal 15 year 2017 from any negotiated settlements is appropriated for 16 the following purposes to be expended in amounts recommended 17 by the Director of Finance and approved by the Governor for 18 the following: repayment to the General Fund Rainy Day Account 19 pursuant to Amendment 803 to the Constitution of 1901; 20 repayment to the Alabama Trust Fund of the amount owed pursuant to Section 29-10-1, Code of Alabama 1975; Medicaid 21 22 Reform; and prison reform and related capital outlay.

23 Section 17. It is the intent of the Legislature that 24 the funds appropriated to the Office of the Senate President 25 Pro Tempore in subsection 8 of Section 2A of this act which 26 are not otherwise designated may be expended by the Senate 27 President Pro Tempore for the same purposes as are authorized for the Lieutenant Governor pursuant to Section 29-4-50, Code
 of Alabama 1975, and the Speaker of the House of
 Representatives pursuant to Section 29-4-60, Code of Alabama
 1975.

5 Section 18. The appropriations made herein to the 6 departments, boards, offices, commissions and agencies include 7 the amounts necessary to pay the SEIB. Notwithstanding Act 8 2015-281, the SEIB rate shall be \$825 per month for each 9 full-time employee for the fiscal year ending September 30, 10 2017. The SEIB shall adjust the insurance program wherever 11 appropriate to maintain the aforementioned fixed rate.

12 Section 19. It is the intent of the Legislature that 13 the Director of Finance shall notify the Chair of the House 14 Ways and Means General Fund Committee, the Chair of the Senate 15 Finance and Taxation General Fund Committee, and the 16 Legislative Fiscal Officer of any interagency transfers, of 17 any type, including contracting, of any of the funds 18 appropriated in this act.

19 Section 20. If any section, paragraph, sentence, 20 clause, provision or portion of this act or all or any portion 21 of any appropriations herein made be held unconstitutional or 22 invalid, it shall not affect any other section, paragraph, 23 sentence, clause, provision or portion of this act or any 24 other appropriation or appropriations or portion thereof 25 hereby made not in and of itself unconstitutional or invalid.

26 Section 21. All laws or parts of laws, general, 27 special, private or local that are in conflict with or inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby
 expressly repealed.

3 Section 22. Each agency of the state funded through 4 the provisions of this act shall provide an equal opportunity 5 for employment and business opportunities for all citizens of 6 this state without regard to sex or race.

7 Section 23. This act shall become effective October
8 1, 2016.
