11	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
12	Section 1. Sections 31-9-80 and 31-9-81, Code of
13	Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:

15	"As used in this article, the following terms shall
16	have the following meanings:
17	"(1) COMMITTEE. The Alabama Disaster Recovery
18	Program Committee.
19	"(2) RECOVERY FUND. The Alabama Disaster Recovery
20	Fund.
21	"(3) RECOVERY PROGRAM. The Alabama Disaster Recovery
22	Program.
23	"(4) SYSTEM. The Statewide Emergency Notification
24	System authorized in the act adding this amendatory language.
25	"§31-9-81.

1	"There is <del>hereby</del> created the Alabama Disaster
2	Recovery Program for the purpose purposes of providing
3	financial assistance to eligible counties and municipalities
4	for meeting local needs $\underline{\text{before}_{m{\ell}}}$ during $\underline{m{\ell}}$ and immediately
5	following a disaster that affects a county or municipality $\overline{\cdot}$
6	and of establishing, implementing, operating, and maintaining
7	the Statewide Emergency Notification System to facilitate
8	statewide communication of emergency responses, decisions, and
9	warnings of developing emergency situations for the benefit of
10	residents and state and local emergency management agencies.
11	The recovery program shall be funded by the Alabama Disaster
12	Recovery Fund. The Legislature may make appropriations to the
13	recovery fund from State General Fund revenues, available
14	federal monies, revenues made available by future legislative
15	acts, or from any other source available except insurance
16	policy surcharges. All revenues appropriated to the recovery
17	fund shall be paid to the Emergency Management Agency and
18	deposited into a separate fund account. All revenues paid into
19	the recovery fund shall remain in the recovery fund until such
20	time as expended as provided in this article, and shall not
21	revert to the State General Fund or be expended for any
22	purposes other than those set out in this article. All
23	revenues appropriated to the recovery fund, except those funds
24	appropriated pursuant to Section 31-9-87, shall be paid to the
25	Emergency Management Agency and deposited into a separate

1	fund. Distribution of funds, except those funds appropriated
2	pursuant to Section 31-9-87, shall be made to eligible
3	counties and municipalities pursuant to procedures established
4	by the Emergency Management Agency in accordance with this
5	article. The recovery fund revenues shall be expended for
6	purposes set out in Section 31-9-83. All revenues appropriated
7	to the recovery fund pursuant to Section 31-9-87 shall be paid
8	to the Emergency Management Agency and deposited into a
9	separate fund which shall be known as the Alabama Statewide
10	Emergency Notification System Fund and shall be expended only
11	as provided in Section 31-9-87."

Section 2. Section 31-9-87 is added to the Code of Alabama 1975, to read as follows:

§31-9-87.

(a) Funds shall be appropriated by the Legislature to the Alabama Statewide Emergency Notification System Fund within the recovery fund for the purposes of establishing, implementing, maintaining, and operating the system, and, thereafter, shall be appropriated annually by the Legislature for continuous maintenance and operation of the system.

Funding for the system may also be derived from gifts, federal grants, other appropriations from the Legislature, fees and contributions from users, or any other sources permitted by law. Any disbursement from the Alabama Statewide Emergency

Notification System Fund shall be authorized in advance by the committee.

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- (b) Within three months after the Legislature appropriates funds for the system, the committee and the State Emergency Management Agency shall jointly develop requirements and specifications for the system. The State Emergency Management Agency shall provide administrative and technical assistance to the committee.
- (c) Any procurement paid in whole or in part with funds from the Alabama Statewide Emergency Notification System Fund shall comply with Article 2, Chapter 16, Title 41, or other law, as applicable.
- (d) The State Emergency Management Agency shall serve as the awarding authority for any procurement paid in whole or in part with funds from the Alabama Statewide Emergency Notification System Fund and upon recommendation of the committee, may purchase, lease, acquire, or otherwise implement the system to serve citizens and state and local emergency management agencies.
- (e) The committee shall submit an annual report to the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the Senate Minority Leader, and the House Minority Leader, the Chairman of the Senate General Fund, and the Chairman of the House General Fund detailing all expenditures in the previous

1	fiscal year, the operation of the program, and its role in
2	Alabama's overall system of preparation, response, and
3	recovery from emergency situations.
4	Section 3. This act shall become effective
5	immediately following its passage and approval by the
6	Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
