23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
24	Section 1. There is hereby established the Alabama
25	Space Authority.
26	Section 2. The authority shall be composed of the
27	Director of the Alabama Department of Commerce, the Director

of the Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs 2 (ADECA), the Director of the Department of Transportation (ALDOT), the Lieutenant Governor, and six other members to be 3 selected from the aerospace, aviation, related industries, or 5 persons having knowledge or interest in space technology, 6 according to the following manner: One member appointed by the 7 Governor, one member appointed by the Lieutenant Governor, two members appointed by the Speaker of the House of 8 9 Representatives, and two members appointed by the President 10 Pro Tempore of the Senate. The four legislative members appointed by the Speaker and Pro Tem shall be two members from 11 12 the democratic party and two members from the GOP appointed. 13 All appointing authorities shall coordinate their appointments 14 so that diversity of gender, race, and geographical areas is 15 reflective of the makeup of this state. In addition, the dean of engineering, or his or her designee, from each Alabama 16 17 university that offers an aerospace engineering degree program shall serve. 18

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Section 3. The authority shall be created as an office in the Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs (ADECA). ADECA shall provide for the initial support needed to apply for grant funding. Upon receipt of grant funding, ADECA shall provide administrative support for the authority.

Section 4. The authority shall have the following duties:

1 (1) To develop either as a state facility, a private 2 facility, or a public-private facility within the State of 3 Alabama a spaceport.

- (2) To lease or rent a spaceport facility consistent with the best interest of the state.
- (3) Encourage the education and training of aerospace professionals to pioneer the frontier of space and to develop new methods and technologies for the exploration of space.
- (4) Promote new space exploration and the maximum use of space capabilities, space tourism, and spaceport technologies across a wide spectrum of corporate, academic, public, and private innovation infrastructures.
- (5) Sponsor aerospace conferences and business roundtables to enable networking among key aerospace leaders and public officials.
- (6) Encourage the leveraging of venture capital and seed public-private partnerships to promote entrepreneurship and expand space enterprise.
- (7) Propose business initiatives, tax credits, small business incubator programs, and other initiatives to stimulate economic development and innovation within the aerospace and space systems communities.
- (8) Promote adequate roads, communications, Internet access, and leverage unique geographical assets such as location, elevation, landforms, and climate to develop terrestrial analog test facilities.

1 (9) Identify, acquire, and manage the development of 2 public lands for space launch and other space-related 3 activities, and encourage space research and education centers 4 to support these programs and facilitate technology transfer.

(10) Work with the Department of Tourism, the Alabama Space Science Exhibit Commission, and other public agencies to communicate the multiple scientific, educational, and commercial benefits of space exploration to the public and to promote space tourism and training.

Section 5. For the purpose of accomplishing the duties enumerated in Section 4, the authority shall have the following powers:

- (1) To borrow money for its corporate purposes and, in evidence of such borrowing, to sell and issue bonds of the authority and to refund any thereof by the issuance of refunding bonds, or other debt instruments.
- (2) To acquire by purchase, gift, or any other lawful means any real, personal, or mixed property necessary or convenient in connection with the purpose for which the authority is formed and to hold title to such property, together with all rights incidental to its estate in such property.
- (3) To exercise the right allocated to the state to acquire property used or useful for the purpose for which the authority is formed as freely and completely as and in the same manner that the State of Alabama is empowered to exercise such rights.

1 (4) To lease all or any part of the facilities or 2 property of the authority to any person and, from time to 3 time, fix, revise, charge, and collect rentals under such 4 leases.

Section 6. The enumeration of duties and powers shall not be construed to give any other public or private entity, department, or subdivision of the state, other than the Alabama Space Authority, the right to exercise the aforementioned powers.

Section 7. The authority may not be dissolved while it still holds outstanding bonds or other unpaid indebtedness.

Section 8. Membership of the authority shall serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed for per diem and travel expenses at the same rate and under the same circumstances as are payable by law to state employees for each day they attend business of the authority.

Section 9. The authority membership shall reflect the racial, gender, geographic, urban and rural, and economic diversity of the state.

Section 10. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
