SYNOPSIS:

State law does not address criminal or civil liability of persons providing in vitro fertilization services.

This bill would provide civil and criminal immunity to persons providing services related to in vitro fertilization if the persons are following commonly accepted practices of care.

A BILL
TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

Relating to in vitro fertilization; to provide civil and criminal immunity to persons following commonly accepted practices of providing in vitro fertilization services.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, an individual or entity that provides services related to in vitro fertilization shall have criminal and civil immunity to the extent the individual or entity follows commonly accepted practices of providing in vitro fertilization services.

Section 2. This act shall become effective immediately.
