22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
23	Section 1. There is created an additional circuit
24	judgeship for the Thirty-seventh Judicial Circuit which shall
25	be designated Circuit Judgeship Number 4.

Section 2. (a) Circuit Judgeship Number 4 shall be
 filled at the general election held in November 2018, or the
 next general election thereafter.

(b) The first judge elected to Circuit Judgeship
Number 4 shall serve for a six-year term, holding office from
the first Monday following the second Tuesday in January after
the 2018 general election or the next general election
thereafter at which that judge is elected.

9 (c) The judge elected to Circuit Judgeship Number 4 10 shall have and shall exercise all the jurisdiction, power, 11 rights, and authority and shall possess all of the 12 qualifications, perform all of the duties, and shall be 13 subject to all of the responsibilities and duties of the 14 office to which other circuit judges are subject.

15 Section 3. The annual compensation of the circuit 16 judges elected pursuant to this act shall be in accordance 17 with Chapter 10A of Title 12, Code of Alabama 1975, including, 18 but not limited to, the provision that no circuit judge first 19 elected or appointed to office after October 1, 2001, shall be 20 provided a salary supplement or expense allowance.

21 Section 4. This act shall become effective 22 immediately following its passage and approval by the 23 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
