3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) After the effective date of this act, beginning after the close of the then current fiscal year, and every two years thereafter, any nonprofit corporation organized under the laws of this state as a nonprofit corporation that is not incorporated pursuant to Title 11, Code of Alabama 1975, which provides water service to the public, shall be audited by the Department of Examiners of Public Accounts in the same manner as public agencies are audited by the department. The department may charge a reasonable fee for the audits.

(b) This section does not apply to or affect any public water supply system, waterworks plant, or water distribution system owned or operated by a municipality or by a public corporation, board, or other entity organized, created, or incorporated pursuant to Title 11 of the Code of Alabama 1975.

Section 2. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
