24	To amend Section 32-6-67, Code of Alabama 1975, as
25	amended by Act 2018-190, 2018 Regular Session, relating to the
26	Legislative Oversight Committee and the distinctive tag

program; to clarify the prohibition of only private or proprietary two-year colleges.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

4 Section 1. Section 32-6-67, Code of Alabama 1975, as 5 amended by Act 2018-190, 2018 Regular Session, is amended to 6 read as follows:

"§32-6-67.

"(a) There is created a legislative committee to 8 9 oversee the implementation and administration of this Article 10 2, except Subdivision 1 of Division 1. The committee shall be composed of three members of the House of Representatives and 11 a county license plate issuing official, who shall be 12 13 appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the Speaker of the House, and three members of the Senate and a county license 14 15 plate issuing official, who shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the Presiding Officer of the Senate. The 16 17 committee shall also be composed of the Secretary of the 18 Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency or his or her designee, a probate judge who is a licensing plate official appointed by 19 20 the President of the Probate Judges Association, and a county 21 licensing plate official who shall be appointed by the Alabama 22 Association of Tax Administrators. The Department of Revenue 23 shall designate a representative, the Department of 24 Transportation shall designate a representative, and the 25 Department of Corrections shall designate a representative of 26 Alabama Correctional Industries as nonvoting and advisory 27 members to the committee. The chair, who shall be picked by

the members of the committee from the legislative members on 1 2 the committee, shall have the authority to call meetings of the committee when he or she deems it necessary or as 3 otherwise provided in this section. 4 5 "(b) The committee shall: "(1) Meet not less than once every six months. 6 7 "(2) Require that a simple majority of committee voting members be in attendance for conducting whatever 8 business requires committee action. 9 10 "(3) Establish guidelines for the gualification of organizations which may sponsor a new or continued issuance of 11 a license plate category, or may benefit from that issuance. 12 13 "(4) Approve, disapprove, or indefinitely postpone, 14 by a vote of two-thirds of the members present at a committee 15 meeting, a request for a new license plate category. 16 "(c) Decisions of the committee concerning approval, 17 disapproval, or indefinite postponement of further action on a 18 proposed distinctive license plate shall be interpreted to be the intent of the entire body of the Legislature, and 19 separate, specific action by the Legislature concerning a 20 21 distinctive license plate proposal shall not be considered. 22 "(d) The committee shall not consider for approval applications from the following types of organizations: 23 24 "(1) Out-of-state colleges and universities except 25 as provided in subsection (e). "(2) Private businesses, business organizations, or 26 27 commercial entities of any type.

"(3) Public schools K-12, junior and private or 1 2 proprietary two-year colleges, and private or proprietary technical schools, exclusive of the Helping Schools Tag as 3 established in Sections 32-6-300 and 32-6-301. 4 5 "(4) Groups within high schools, junior colleges, universities, and technical schools, such as band boosters, 6 7 athletic boosters, and the like. "(5) Unions. 8 "(6) Political organizations. 9 10 "(7) Religious organizations. "(8) Groups that promote racial or social 11 12 disharmony. 13 "(9) Public officials. 14 "(e) The committee may consider and approve an 15 application for a distinctive license plate for an out-of-state college or university, upon submission of an 16 17 application pursuant to Section 32-6-64. 18 "(f) Upon the request of the chair, the Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the House shall provide clerical 19 20 assistance necessary for the work of the committee. 21 "(g) The committee members who are members of the Legislature shall be entitled to, and shall receive, the same 22 23 daily legislative compensation, expense allowances, per diem, 24 and other compensation which they receive while in legislative 25 session for each weekday, Monday through Friday, during any 26 week in which the committee actually meets. The non-legislative members of the committee shall be entitled to, 27

1 and shall receive, the same per diem and expenses that are 2 paid to state employees."

3 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 4 first day of the third month following its passage and 5 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
