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6 ENROLLED, An Act,

7 To authorize the City Council of the City of Hoover  
8 in Jefferson County and Shelby County, pursuant to Amendment  
9 No. 373 of the Constitution of Alabama 1901, to increase the  
10 rate of the ad valorem tax levied and collected on all taxable  
11 property in the city which is authorized pursuant to the  
12 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, by an additional 2.4 mills on  
13 each dollar (\$0.24 on each one hundred dollars) of assessed  
14 value to be used exclusively for public school purposes.

15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

16 Section 1. This act shall apply to the City of  
17 Hoover in Jefferson County and Shelby County.

18 Section 2. For the purposes of this act, the  
19 following words have the following meanings:

20 (1) AMENDMENT NO 373. Amendment No. 373 of the  
21 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 217  
22 of the Recompiled Constitution of Alabama of 1901.

23 (2) CITY. The City of Hoover, Alabama.

24 (3) CITY GENERAL AD VALOREM TAX. The tax authorized  
25 pursuant to the applicable provisions of the general laws of

1 this state and the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to be  
2 levied by the city for general municipal purposes including  
3 public school purposes.

4 Section 3. The city presently levies and collects  
5 the city general ad valorem tax. Pursuant to a resolution  
6 adopted by the City Council of the City of Hoover after a  
7 public hearing in accordance with Amendment No. 373, the City  
8 of Hoover proposes to increase the rate at which it may levy  
9 and collect the city general ad valorem tax by an additional  
10 2.4 mills (\$0.24 on each one hundred dollars) of assessed  
11 value for public school purposes.

12 Section 4. Pursuant to subsection (f) of Amendment  
13 No. 373 and a resolution adopted by the City Council of the  
14 City of Hoover after a public hearing, the city may increase  
15 the rate at which the city levies and collects the town  
16 general ad valorem tax by a maximum rate increase for any tax  
17 year equal to 2.4 mills (\$0.24 on each one hundred dollars) of  
18 assessed value, to be used and expended exclusively for public  
19 school purposes.

20 Section 5. The increase in the rate at which the  
21 city general ad valorem tax may be levied and collected  
22 pursuant to this act is subject to approval by a majority of  
23 the qualified electors residing in the city who vote on the  
24 proposed increase at a special election called and held for  
25 that purpose pursuant to subsection (f) of Amendment No. 373.

1                   Section 6. This act shall become effective  
2 immediately following its passage and approval by the  
3 governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
