1 SB178 2 3 4 ENROLLED, An Act, 5 To make appropriations for the ordinary expenses of 6 the executive, legislative, and judicial agencies of the 7 State, for other functions of government, for debt service, 8 and for capital outlay for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2019. 9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: 10 11 Section 1. The monies in Section 2 are appropriated 12 from the named funds for the 2019 fiscal year to the state 13 agencies indicated, as the amounts to be used to pay the 14 expenditures of the named agencies, and are in lieu of all 15 monies appropriated for these purposes in other sections of 16 the Alabama Statutes. 17 For the purpose of this act, the amounts herein for 18 expenditures are listed by programmatic area and the totals 19 for all programs are shown by the source of funds. It is 20 intended that only the herein named funds be appropriated in 21 the amounts specified to the named agencies and that the

22 following definitions shall be applicable.

23 "Appropriation Total" shall mean the aggregate total24 of all funding sources.

"Program" shall mean specific governmental services required to achieve a specific objective. A program shall be directed to meeting the need of an identified clientele, or group of recipients or beneficiaries, and shall be expended only for such purposes.

6 "Capital Outlay" shall mean expenditures which 7 result in the acquisition and/or addition to items, such as 8 land or buildings, which have an appreciable and calculable 9 period of usefulness in excess of one year, and shall be 10 expended only for such purposes.

"Debt Service" shall mean an expenditure for the payment of interest and principal on bonded debt obligations of the State, and shall be expended only for such purposes.

14 "Federal and Local Funds" shall mean all gifts,
15 grants, contributions, or entitlements, including grants by
16 the Congress of the United States, municipalities or counties.

17 Section 2. There is hereby appropriated the amounts set forth herein for the ordinary expenses of the 18 19 executive, legislative, and judicial agencies of the State, for other functions of government, for debt service, and for 20 21 capital outlay for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2019, 22 to be paid out of any monies hereinafter specified, from such 23 other funds and accounts as may be designated, or so much 24 thereof as may be necessary, and the total amount to be ex-25 pended for the items for which the appropriation is herein

Section 3. In addition to the amounts otherwise 18 19 appropriated in this act, there is hereby appropriated from the several funds in the State Treasury, except the Education 20 21 Trust Fund, and in the same proportion as the salaries of the 22 several State officials and employees are paid, such 23 additional amounts as may be necessary to pay for a three 24 percent (3.0%) salary increase enacted in the 2018 Regular 25 Session. The additional amounts appropriated in this section 26 from the State General Fund shall not exceed \$14,540,000 for 27 the fiscal year ending September 30, 2019. The Director of

1 Finance shall ensure that first priority shall be given to all 2 State General Fund payrolls, including the payroll of the Legislature. State agencies shall receive additional 3 allocations from the appropriation made in this section from 4 5 the State General Fund in amounts necessary to increase total 6 salaries paid from the State General Fund by three percent. The remainder of this appropriation from the State General 7 8 Fund may be allotted by the Director of Finance to those agencies which receive transfers from the State General Fund. 9

10 Section 4. In addition to the amounts otherwise 11 appropriated in this act, there is hereby appropriated from 12 the several funds in the State Treasury, except the Education 13 Trust Fund, and in the same proportion as the salaries of the 14 several State officials and employees are paid, such 15 additional amounts as may be necessary to pay for a one-time 16 bonus for certain retirees of the Employees' Retirement System 17 enacted in the 2018 Regular Session. The additional amounts appropriated in this section from the State General Fund shall 18 19 not exceed \$1,742,000 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 20 2019. The Director of Finance shall ensure that first priority 21 shall be given to all State General Fund payrolls, including 22 the payroll of the Legislature. State agencies may receive 23 additional allocations from the appropriation made in this 24 section from the State General Fund in amounts necessary to 25 grant the bonus from the State General Fund. The remainder of

this appropriation from the State General Fund may be allotted by the Director of Finance to those agencies which receive transfers from the State General Fund. The funds appropriated for the bonus in this section are conditioned upon the enactment of SB215 or HB440 during the 2018 Regular Session authorizing such bonus.

Section 5. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this act or any other act, any amounts from appropriations for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2018, to the various state agencies in this act which were unexpended and reverted on September 30, 2018, are hereby reappropriated to the respective offices for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2018.

14 Section 6. In addition to all other appropriations 15 heretofore or hereafter made, there is hereby appropriated 16 such amounts as may be necessary for the fiscal year ending 17 September 30, 2019, to the Retirement Systems of Alabama from 18 the Senior Services Trust Fund to comply with Section 19 41-15C-1, Code of Alabama 1975.

20 Section 7. In addition to all other appropriations 21 heretofore or hereafter made, there is hereby conditionally 22 appropriated any and all amounts from tobacco settlement or 23 litigation for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2019. The 24 amounts are conditioned upon the State of Alabama receiving 25 revenue from tobacco settlement or litigation and upon the

recommendation of the Director of Finance, the Chairs of the
House Ways and Means General Fund Committee and the Senate
Finance and Taxation-General Fund Committee, and the approval
of the Governor. The conditional appropriation made herein
shall be allocated pursuant to Sections 41-10-620 through
41-10-639 and Sections 41-15B-1 through 41-15B-8, Code of
Alabama 1975.

8 Section 8. Except as may be herein otherwise 9 provided, amounts herein specifically appropriated shall be in 10 lieu of the amounts heretofore provided or appropriated by law 11 for such purposes. The amounts herein appropriated are the 12 maximum amounts to be expended for the purposes herein 13 designated and in no event shall the maximum expenditure 14 provided for any items of expense exceed the amount allocated 15 herein except as may be further provided for under this act, 16 as provided in the Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 17 41-19-1, et seq., Code of Alabama 1975, and those appropriations herein made, except appropriations to the 18 19 Alabama Alcoholic Beverage Control Board for the purchase of 20 alcoholic beverages, are and shall be subject to the terms, 21 conditions, provisions and limitations of Sections 41-4-80, et 22 seq., Code of Alabama 1975, and the Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 41-19-1, et seq., Code of Alabama 1975. 23

24 Section 9. Any surplus remaining in any 25 appropriation herein made from the State General Fund to any

office, department, bureau, board, commission or agency may be transferred, on order of the Governor, to any other appropriation herein made from the State General Fund when such appropriation to any office, department, bureau, board, commission or agency is insufficient to pay salaries in that office, department, bureau, board, commission or agency.

Section 10. In addition to appropriations herein 7 8 made, all gifts, grants, insurance proceeds, contributions or 9 entitlements, in excess of the amount carried in this act, 10 including grants by the Congress of the United States, 11 municipalities or counties, to any department, division, 12 board, bureau, commission, agency, institution, office or 13 officer of the State of Alabama are hereby appropriated and, 14 in the event the same are recurring, are reappropriated to 15 such department, division, board, bureau, commission, agency, 16 institution, office or officer to be used only for the purpose 17 or purposes for which the grant or contribution was or shall be made. Further, all state, county, municipal and educational 18 entities are authorized to disburse such sums as deemed 19 20 necessary by mutual agreement between said entities and the 21 State of Alabama, Department of Examiners of Public Accounts 22 to partially defray the cost of auditing services performed by 23 said agency. All such sums are hereby appropriated and 24 reappropriated if necessary to the Department of Examiners of

Public Accounts for audit services, to be expended through the
 fund established by Section 41-5-24, Code of Alabama 1975.

Section 11. The Department of Examiners of Public 3 Accounts is hereby authorized to examine as deemed necessary 4 5 all appropriations herein made for compliance with the laws of 6 the State of Alabama. Any examination performed shall be in accordance with the provisions of Title 41, Chapter 5, Code of 7 8 Alabama 1975. It is the intent of the Legislature that all 9 state agencies cooperate with the Examiners of Public Accounts 10 to provide the information necessary to conduct recovery 11 audits as provided for in Section 41-5-6.1, Code of Alabama 12 1975.

13 Section 12. Upon certification to the Director of 14 Finance by the State Attorney General that a federal court has 15 ordered the State of Alabama to pay claims, attorney fees, or 16 other costs relating to said court order, funds are hereby 17 appropriated to the affected department, board, bureau, or commission from the appropriate fund or funds of such 18 19 department, board, bureau or commission in the amount 20 necessary to satisfy that court order. Such appropriations are 21 in addition to any other appropriation heretofore or hereafter 22 made in this appropriation act. Such appropriations are 23 conditioned upon the availability of funds and a determination 24 by the Director of Finance that existing appropriations are 25 not available for the court-ordered payments.

1 Section 13. All interest earned from funds paid into Account No. 0396 by Act 87-761, Act 88-947, Act 89-79, Act 2 90-556 and Act 91-572 are hereby appropriated to the 3 Governor's Contingency Fund to be spent at the discretion of 4 5 the Governor. Any other interest earned by the state from 6 Revenue Sharing Investments under the State and Local Fiscal Assistance Act of 1972, as amended, Public Law 92-512, 92nd 7 8 Congress, together with any accruals or reversions thereon are 9 hereby appropriated to the State General Fund.

10 Section 14. All encumbered balances of a previous 11 fiscal year appropriation, other than the exclusions authorized by this act or in Section 41-4-93, Code of Alabama 12 13 1975, shall lapse no later than September 30 of the fiscal 14 year immediately following the fiscal year for which the 15 appropriation was made and shall revert to the credit of the 16 State General Fund or earmarked fund from which the 17 appropriation or appropriations were made.

18 Section 15. The appropriations made herein to the departments, boards, offices, commissions and agencies include 19 the amounts necessary, and said departments, boards, offices, 20 21 commissions and agencies are hereby directed to make the 22 transfer of funds to the State Personnel Department in said amounts enumerated in this act. All agencies enumerated in 23 24 this act and receiving services from other governmental 25 agencies enumerated in this act shall make full payment in a

1 timely manner (as determined by the Department of Finance) for 2 such services.

Section 16. All funds collected under Section 3 40-12-43.1, Code of Alabama 1975, between the effective date 4 of Act 98-191 and September 30, 2018 are hereby appropriated 5 6 to the Auburn University Center for Governmental Services for the administration of the examiner certification program 7 established by the Alabama Local Tax Institute of Standards 8 and Training as provided in Section 40-12-43.1, Code of 9 Alabama 1975. 10

11 Section 17. It is the intent of the Legislature that 12 the funds appropriated to the Office of the Senate President 13 Pro Tempore in subsection 6 of Section 2A of this act which 14 are not otherwise designated may be expended by the Senate 15 President Pro Tempore for the same purposes as are authorized 16 for the Lieutenant Governor pursuant to Section 29-4-50, Code 17 of Alabama 1975, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives pursuant to Section 29-4-60, Code of Alabama 18 1975. 19

20 Section 18. The appropriations made herein to the 21 departments, boards, offices, commissions and agencies include 22 the amounts necessary to pay the SEIB. The SEIB rate shall be 23 \$930 per month for each full-time employee for the fiscal year 24 ending September 30, 2019. The SEIB shall adjust the insurance 25 program wherever appropriate to maintain the aforementioned

fixed rate; however, it is the intent of the Legislature that the Board not increase the out of pocket costs to active and retired members.

4 Section 19. It is the intent of the Legislature that 5 the Director of Finance shall notify the Chair of the House 6 Ways and Means General Fund Committee, the Chair of the Senate 7 Finance and Taxation-General Fund Committee, and the Deputy 8 Director of the Legislative Services Agency-Fiscal Division of 9 any interagency transfers, of any type, including contracting, 10 of any of the funds appropriated in this act.

11 Section 20. If any section, paragraph, sentence, 12 clause, provision or portion of this act or all or any portion 13 of any appropriations herein made be held unconstitutional or 14 invalid, it shall not affect any other section, paragraph, 15 sentence, clause, provision or portion of this act or any 16 other appropriation or appropriations or portion thereof 17 hereby made not in and of itself unconstitutional or invalid.

Section 21. All laws or parts of laws, general, special, private or local that are in conflict with or inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby expressly repealed.

22 Section 22. Each agency of the state funded through 23 the provisions of this act shall provide an equal opportunity 24 for employment and business opportunities for all citizens of 25 this state without regard to sex or race.

Section 23. This act shall become effective October
 1, 2018.
