8 SYNOPSIS: Under existing law, a person who is blind or 9 partially blind or hearing impaired may be 10 accompanied by a guide dog or hearing dog in places 11 of public accommodation. In addition, a person who 12 is training a guide dog and is employed by an 13 accredited school is granted the same privilege. A 14 violation of this law is a misdemeanor.

This bill would provide that a person with a physical disability may be accompanied by a service animal specially trained to assist the person with the disability and would grant a person training a service animal the same privilege. A violation would be subject to the same penalty.

Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901 prohibits a general law whose purpose or effect would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds from becoming effective with regard to a local governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote unless: it comes within one of a number of specified exceptions; it is approved

1 by the affected entity; or the Legislature 2 appropriates funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to the entity for the purpose. 3 4 The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local 5 6 funds within the meaning of Amendment 621. However, 7 the bill does not require approval of a local governmental entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to 8 become effective because it comes within one of the 9 10 specified exceptions contained in Amendment 621. 11 12 A BILL 13 TO BE ENTITLED 14 AN ACT 15 To amend Section 21-7-4 of the Code of Alabama 1975, 16 17 authorizing a blind or hearing impaired person, or a person training a guide dog under certain conditions, to be 18 accompanied by a guide dog or hearing dog; to authorize a 19 person who is physically disabled to be accompanied by a 20 21 service animal, specially trained to assist the disabled 22 person; to provide that a person training a service animal 23 would be granted the same privileges; and in connection 24 therewith would have as its purpose or effect the requirement 25 of a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the 26 meaning of Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama of 27 1901.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

2 Section 1. Section 21-7-4 of the Code of Alabama
3 1975, is amended to read as follows:

"§21-7-4.

5 "<u>(a) For the purposes of this section, the term</u> 6 <u>"service animal" means a quide dog, hearing dog, signal dog,</u> 7 <u>or other animal specially trained or being trained to assist a</u> 8 person with a physical disability.

"(b) Every person with a disability, including a 9 10 person who is totally or partially blind, person shall have the right to be accompanied by a quide dog, especially trained 11 12 for the purpose, and every hearing-impaired, or diagnosed on 13 the autism spectrum person shall have the right to be 14 accompanied by a hearing dog service animal, especially 15 trained for the purpose, and every person employed by an 16 accredited school for training guide dogs shall have the right 17 to be accompanied by a quide dog in training in any public place, including a public or private school, and any of the 18 places listed in Section 21-7-3. without being The person may 19 20 not be required to pay an extra charge for the dog however, 21 the person shall be liable for any damages done to the 22 premises or facilities by the dog service animal.

"(c) A person training a service animal shall be
 entitled to the same privileges granted to a person with a
 disability pursuant to subsection (b).

"(d) This section does not relieve a person
 accompanied by a service animal from liability for any damages
 done to the premises or facilities by the service animal."
 Section 2. Although this bill would have as its

5 purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased 6 expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further 7 requirements and application under Amendment 621 because the 8 bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an 9 existing crime.

10 Section 3. This act shall become effective on the 11 first day of the third month following its passage and 12 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
