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18	To amend Section 17-4-30, Code of Alabama 1975,
19	relating to voter registration lists; to revise the process
20	used by the Secretary of State and local boards of registrars
21	to update current address information on registered voters
22	based on information supplied by the United States Postal
23	Service.
24	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
25	Section 1. Section 17-4-30 of the Code of Alabama
26	1975, is amended to read as follows:
27	"§17-4-30.

"(a) Beginning in January 1997 February 2021, and in 1 January February of every fourth year thereafter, the boards 2 of registrars shall mail a nonforwardable notice to all 3 registered voters in the county. The notice shall be designed 4 and provided for the boards of registrars by the Secretary of 5 State. The notice shall be sent on a postcard providing 6 7 general information on elections. The notice shall be mailed to the last known address of the voter appearing on the voter 8 registration list. If the notice is returned to the boards of 9 10 registrars indicating that the voter may have relocated, the board shall send a forwardable notice to the registered voter 11 12 on which the voter may confirm his or her current address. The forwardable notice shall be mailed no later than 90 days after 13 receipt of the returned nonforwardable notice Secretary of 14 State or board of registrars shall utilize change-of-address 15 information supplied by the United States Postal Service 16 17 through its licensees to identify registered voters whose 18 addresses may have changed. 19 "(b)(1) If the Secretary of State or board of 20 registrars determines from the information provided by the United States Postal Service that a voter has moved to a 21 different residence address that is under the jurisdiction of 22 the same board of registrars, the board of registrars shall 23 24 change the registration records of that voter to show the new 25 address, and the board of registrars, or its agent, within 90

26 <u>days after identifying the potential change, shall send the</u>

27 voter a notice of the change by forwardable mail including a

1	postage prepaid preaddressed return card on which the
2	registered voter may verify or correct his or her current
3	address information.
4	" <u>(2) If the Secretary of State or board of</u>
5	registrars determines from the information provided by the
6	<u>United States Postal Service that a voter has moved to a</u>
7	different residence address that is under the jurisdiction of
8	a different board of registrars, the Secretary of State or
9	board of registrars, within 90 days after identifying the
10	potential change, shall send the voter a notice of the change
11	by forwardable mail including a postage prepaid and
12	preaddressed return card on which the registered voter may
13	verify or correct his or her current address information.
14	"(3) If the Secretary of State or board of
15	registrars determines from the information provided by the
16	United States Postal Service that a voter has moved to a
17	different residence address outside of the State of Alabama,
18	the Secretary of State or board of registrars, within 90 days
19	after identifying the potential change, shall send the voter a
20	notice of the change by forwardable mail including a postage
21	prepaid and preaddressed return card on which the registered
22	voter may verify or correct his or her current address
23	information.

24 "(c) Notice provided to a registered voter pursuant 25 to subdivision (1), (2), or (3) of subsection (b) shall inform 26 the voter of all of the following:

1	"(1) If the voter did not change his or her
2	residence, or changed his or her residence but remained under
3	the jurisdiction of the same board of registrars, the voter
4	shall be required to return the card to that board of
5	registrars no later than the last day to register to vote
6	before an election.
7	"(2) If the card is not returned within the
8	specified time, the voter shall be required to complete a
9	voter registration update form before he or she is permitted
10	to vote in an election during the period beginning on the date
11	the notice was mailed and ending on the day after the date of
12	the second general election for federal office that occurs
13	after the date the notice was mailed.
14	"(3) If the voter does not update his or her voter
15	registration record or does not vote in an election during the
16	period beginning on the date the notice was mailed and ending
17	on the day after the date of the second general election for
18	federal office that occurs after the date the notice was
19	mailed, his or her name shall be removed from the list of
20	eligible voters.
21	"(4) If the voter has changed his or her residence
22	to an address outside of the jurisdiction of the board of
23	registrars under which he or she is then registered,
24	information concerning how the voter may maintain his or her
25	eligibility to vote.
26	" <u>(d)</u> The boards <u>Secretary of State or board</u> of
27	registrars shall record and maintain in the statewide voter

registration database the dates on which the nonforwardable notice was is mailed to a registered voter and the card is returned to the board and the date on which the forwardable notice was mailed to by the registered voter.

5 "(b)(e) The boards of registrars shall update the 6 voter list for the county statewide voter registration 7 <u>database</u> using the information reported to the board by the 8 registered voters on the address confirmation cards provided 9 for in subsection (a) this section.

10 "(f) If the registered voter does not respond to the 11 forwardable notice on which the registered voter may confirm 12 his or her address the notice provided in this section within 90 days of the date on which the notice was mailed or if the 13 forwardable notice is returned to the board of registrars as 14 undeliverable, the boards board of registrars, or its agent, 15 shall place the name of the registered voter on the inactive 16 17 list of registered voters and in a suspense file in the office 18 of the board. The suspense file shall contain all of the 19 following information: change the status of the voter to 20 inactive and, in the statewide voter registration database, shall indicate the date the change is recorded and that the 21 22 voter did not respond to the mailing or that the mailing was 23 returned as undeliverable, in a manner provided by rule 24 adopted by the Secretary of State pursuant to the Alabama 25 Administrative Procedure Act. "(1) The name of the registered voter. 26

27 "(2) The last known address of the registered voter.

- "(3) At least the last four digits of the Social 1 2 Security number or other personal identification number of the 3 registered voter. "(4) The date on which the name of the registered 4 voter was placed in the suspense file. 5 "(c) The name of a registered voter who does not 6 vote or appear to vote in one of the next two federal 7 elections held after his or her name is placed in the suspense 8 file shall be removed from the voter list. 9 10 "(d) (g) The name of any voter who receives notice pursuant to this section and fails to update his or her voter 11 12 registration record, or does not vote in an election during 13 the period beginning on the date the notice is mailed and 14 ending on the day after the date of the second general 15 election for federal office that occurs after the date the notice is mailed, shall be removed from the list of eligible 16 17 voters. The names of persons to be removed from the list of 18 registered voters pursuant to this section shall be published in accordance with Section 17-4-10. 19 "(h) The Secretary of State shall promulgate rules 20 as necessary to implement this section in accordance with the 21 22 Alabama Administrative Procedure Act. 23 "(i) The Secretary of State may act as an agent for 24 the boards of registrars in implementing this section." 25 Section 2. This act shall become effective 26 immediately following its passage and approval by the
- 27 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
