17	(3) Rosa Parks spent all of her life advocating for
18	Civil Rights for African-Americans; and
19	(4) Following the death of Rosa Parks, her body lay
20	in honor in the rotunda of the United States Capitol, making
21	her the first woman given such honor, the second
22	African-American, and the first American who was not a

24	(5) A statue of Rosa Parks was placed in the

1 (6) The Legislature does hereby find that a 2 commemorative statue to honor Rosa Parks would be a worthy addition to the grounds of the Alabama State Capitol, and it 3 supports the inclusion of such a statue in a place of 4 5 prominence on the West front of the Capitol facing Bainbridge 6 Street that will convey to future generations the importance 7 of Rosa Parks to the State of Alabama, the United States, and the world. 8

9 Section 2. The Legislature does hereby find as10 follows as to Helen Keller:

(1) Helen Keller was born in Tuscumbia and, at age nineteen months, contracted an illness which left her deaf and blind; and

14 (2) How Helen Keller learned to communicate is a
15 quintessential story of overcoming adversity and is
16 inspirational to many people in Alabama, the United States,
17 and the world; and

(3) A statue of Helen Keller is in the National
Statuary Hall Collection as one of two statues representing
Alabama since 2009, making hers one of only nine statues in
the Collection representing women; and

(4) The Legislature does hereby find that a commemorative statue to honor Helen Keller would be a worthy addition to the grounds of the Alabama State Capitol, and it supports the inclusion of such a statue in a place where it will be readily accessible to, and touchable by, disabled persons.

Section 3. (a) The Alabama Historical Commission and 1 2 the Division of Construction Management of the Department of Finance shall commission monuments in dedication to, and in 3 recognition of, Rosa Parks and Helen Keller. The statue of 4 5 Rosa Parks shall be placed on the West front of the Capitol facing Bainbridge Street. The statue of Helen Keller shall be 6 7 placed on the grounds of the Capitol in a place where it will be readily accessible to, and touchable by, disabled persons. 8

9 (b) The commission and division shall solicit input 10 from the public and other interested parties to develop the 11 plan for the placement of, and proposed designs for, the 12 monuments.

(c) Public and private funds, including in-kind
services, may be used to commission the monuments for Rosa
Parks and Helen Keller.
